

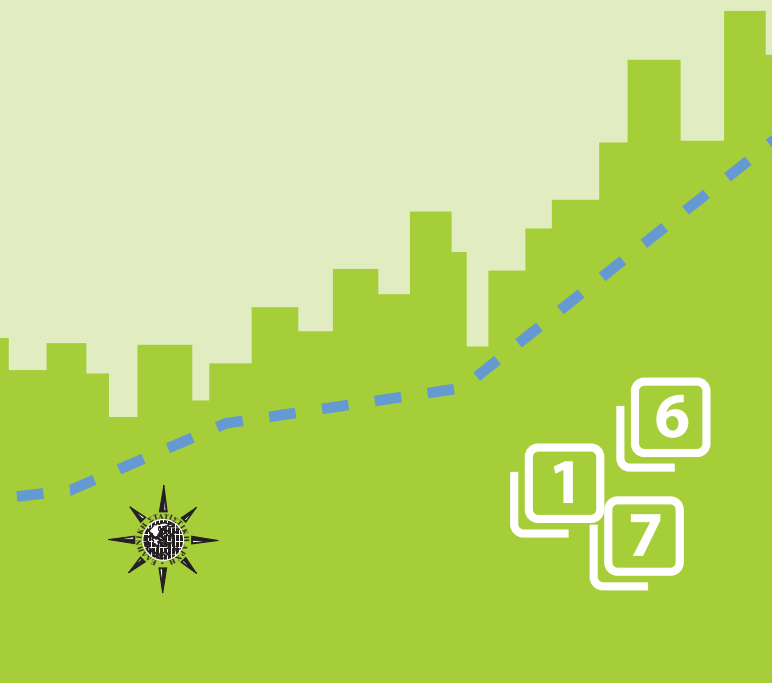

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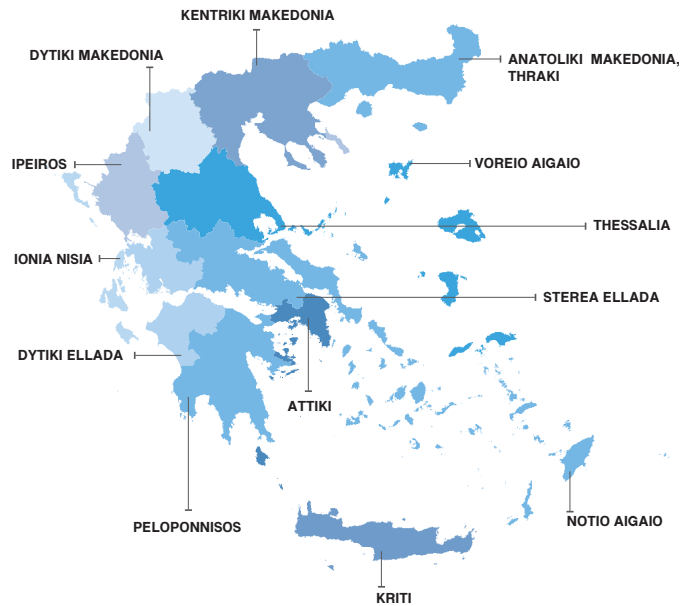

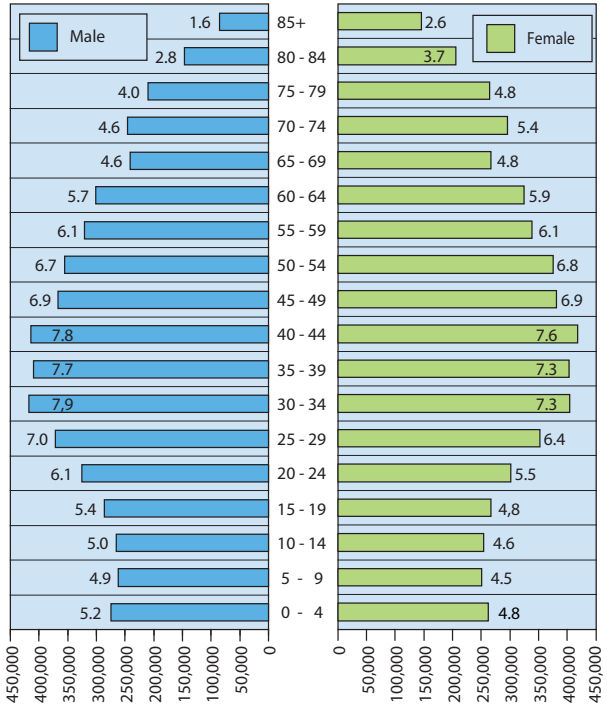

**Age groups: population and percent share by gender**



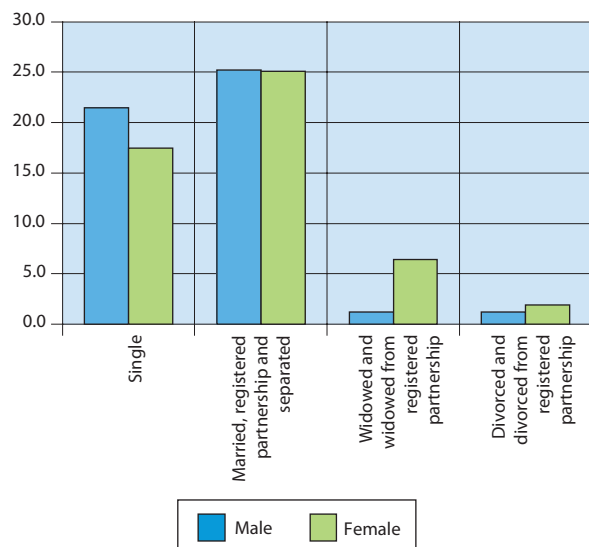

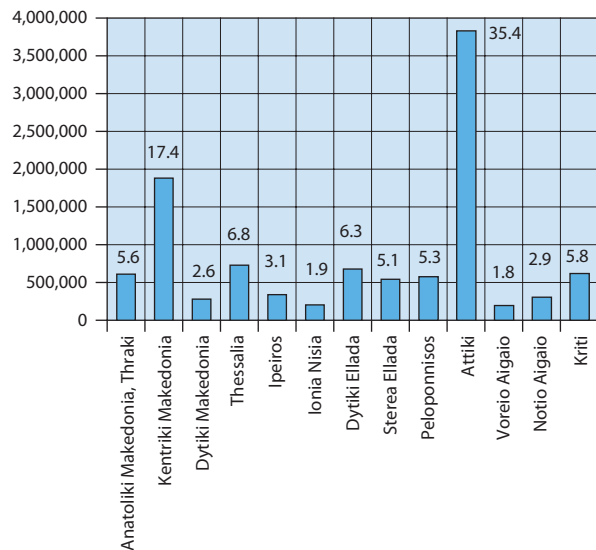

**Distribution (%) of Resident Population by region**

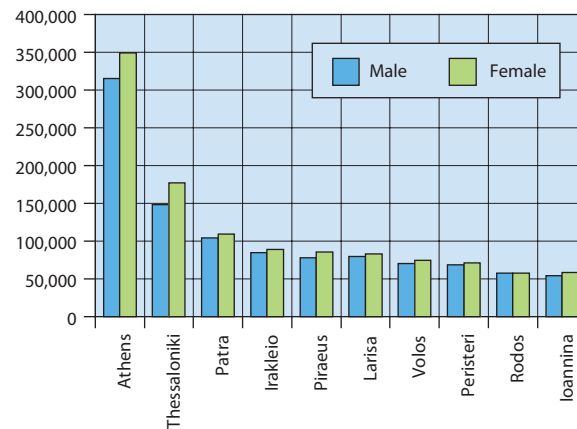

Municipalities of Greece**

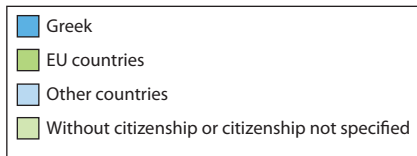
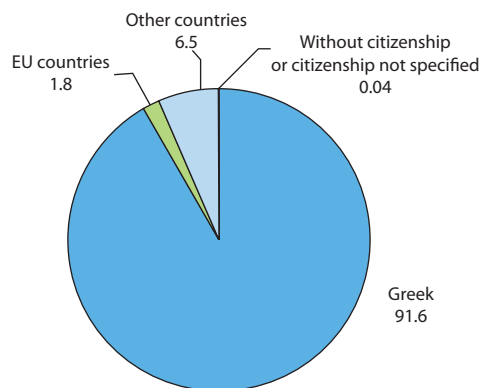

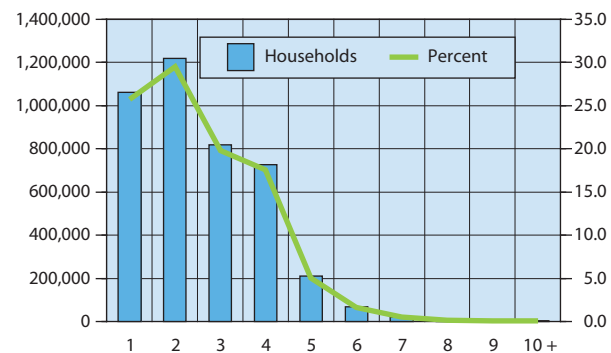

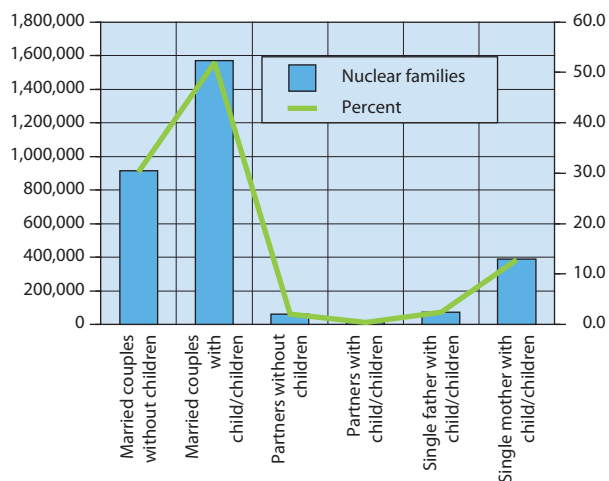

The total fertility rate is used in order to determine the level of replacement of the generations, which, in developed countries is considered to be 2.1.

Total mortality rate: the number of deaths per 1,000 people.

Infant mortality rate: the number of children dying at less than 1 year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.

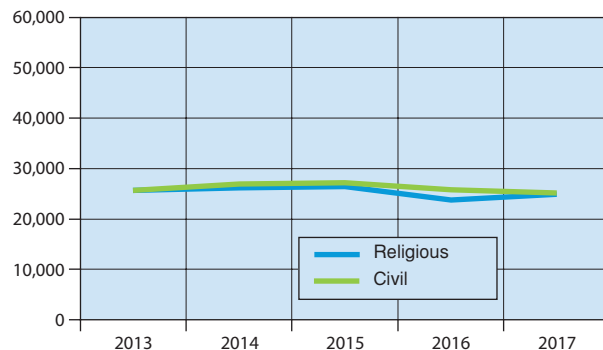

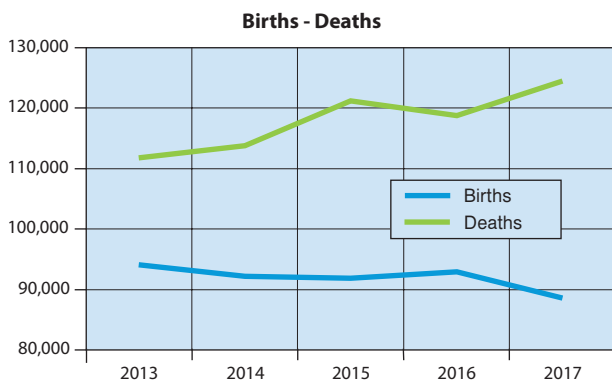

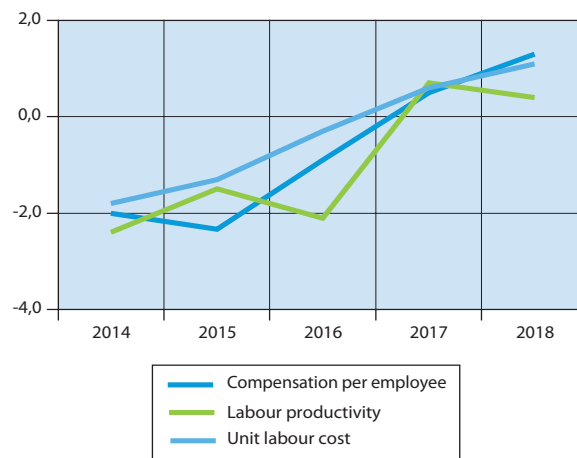

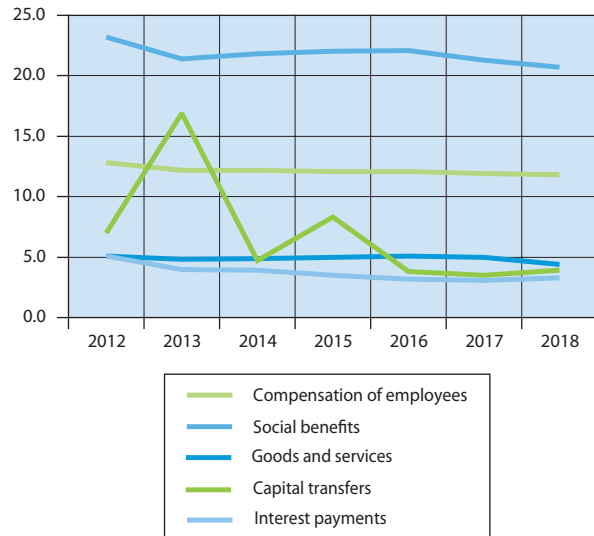

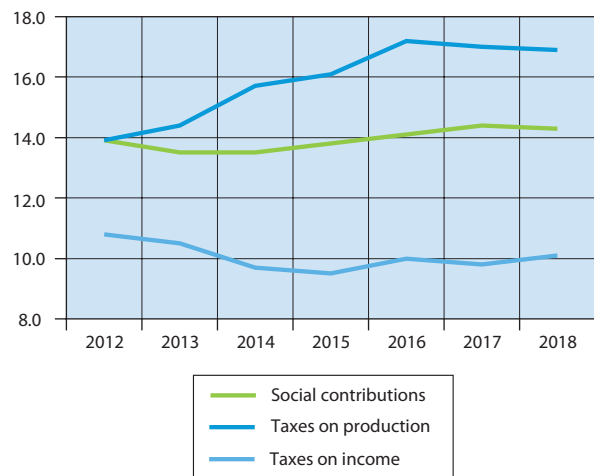
Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP



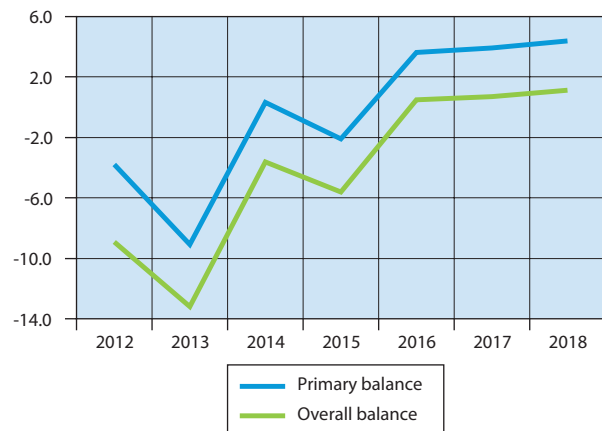
Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP

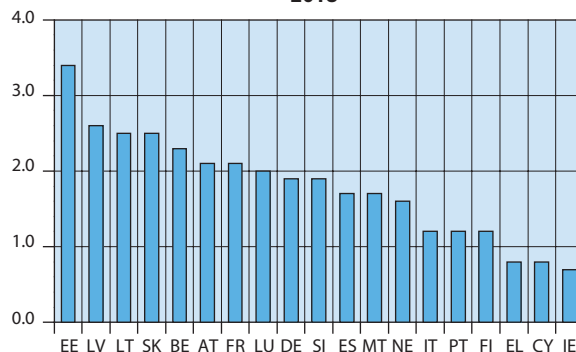

**14. EU: Gross domestic product (GDP) per capita in purchasing power standards, 2013 - 2017**

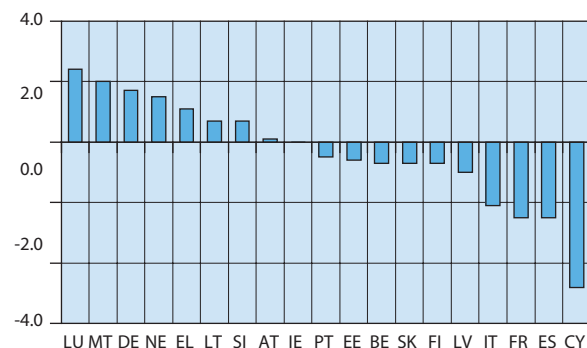

**Euro area countries: General Government deficit/surplus as a percentage of GDP, 2018**


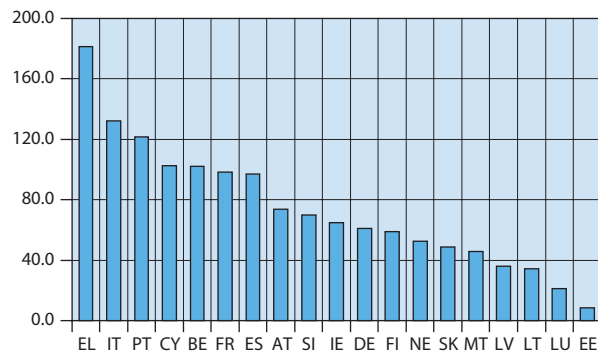

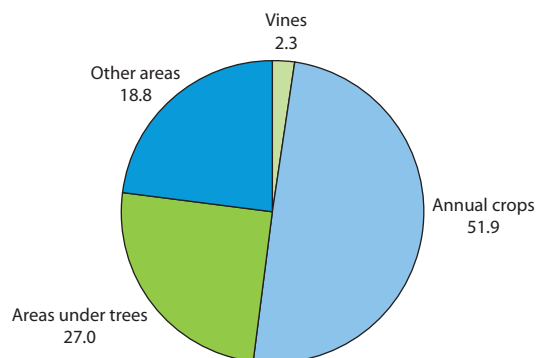

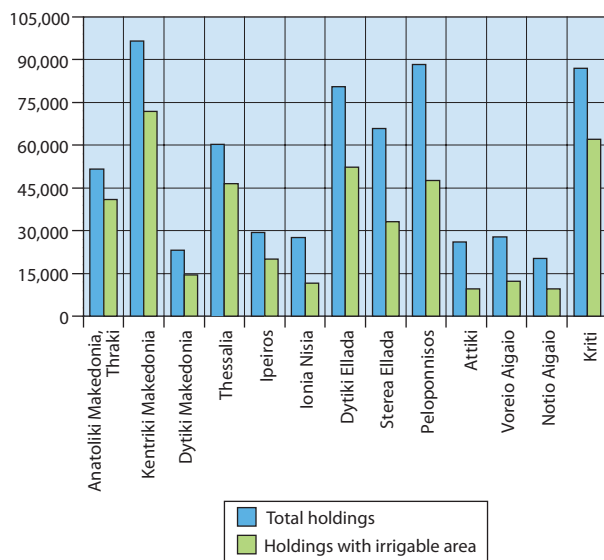

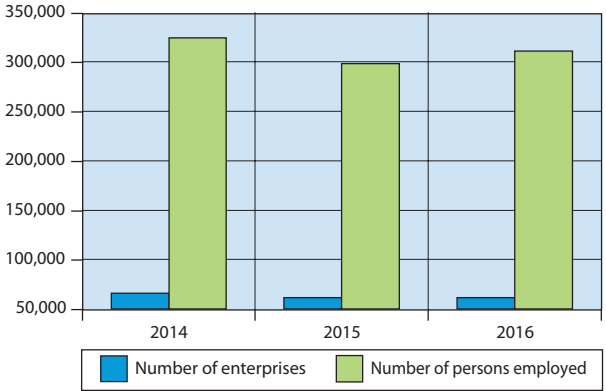

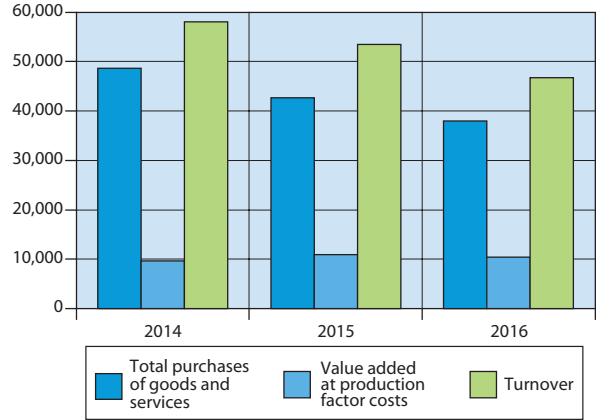

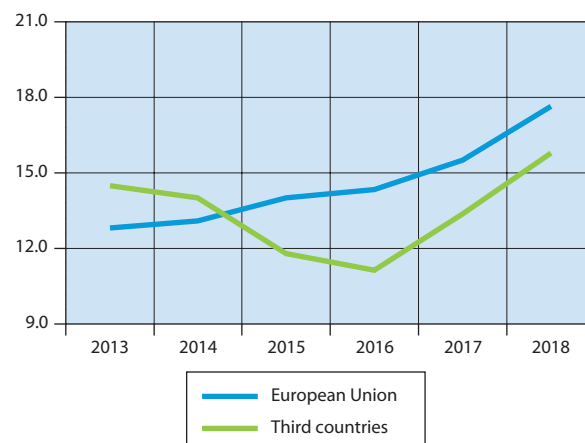

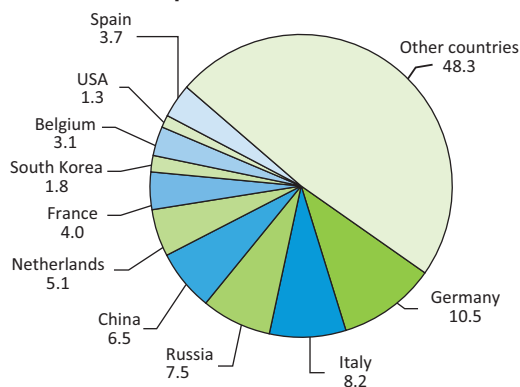

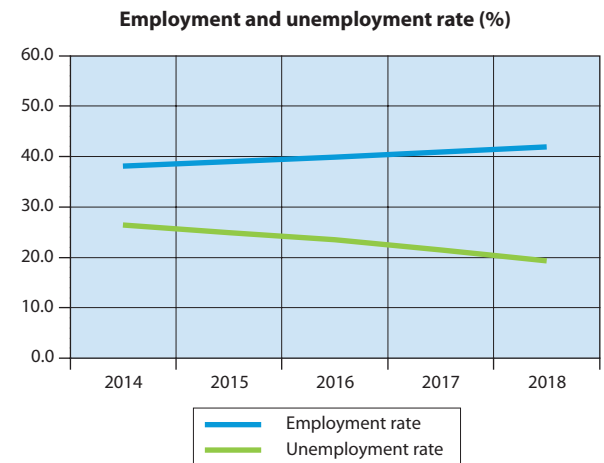

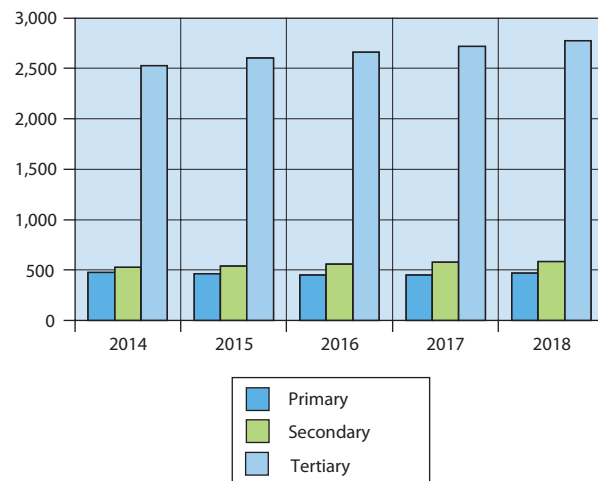
Population aged 15 years and over by employment status

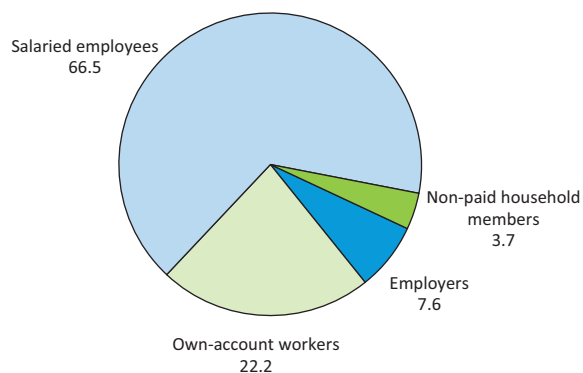

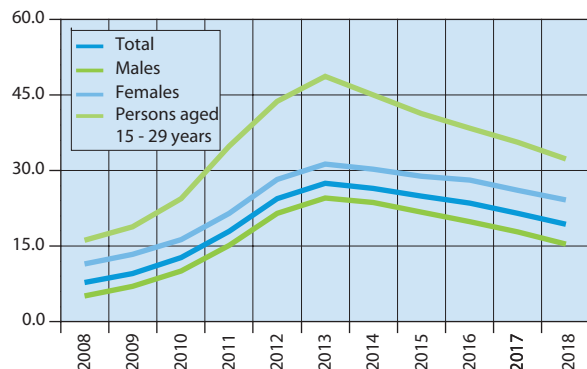

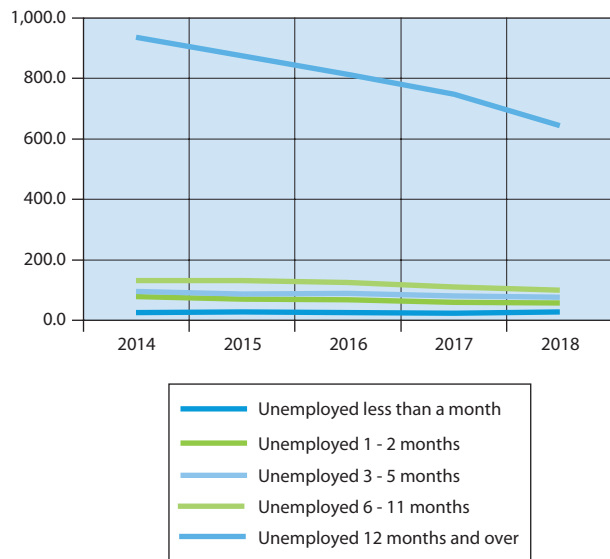

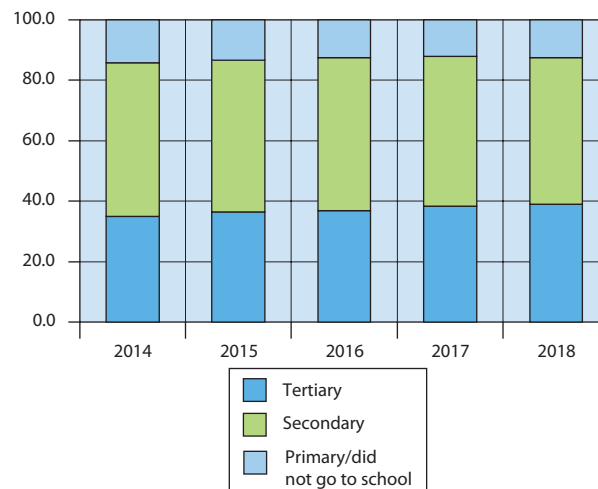

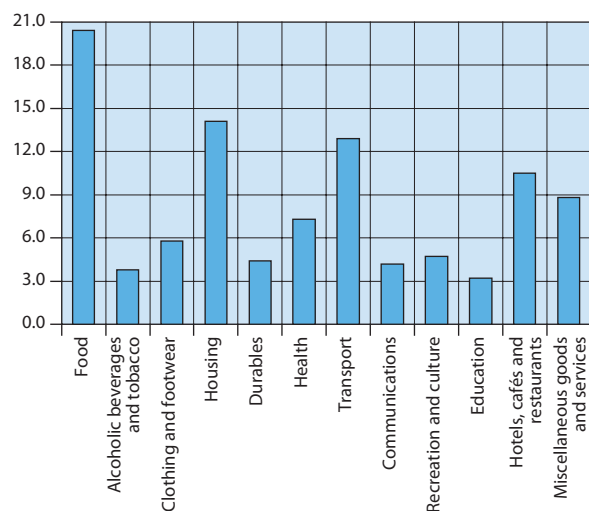

Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2017

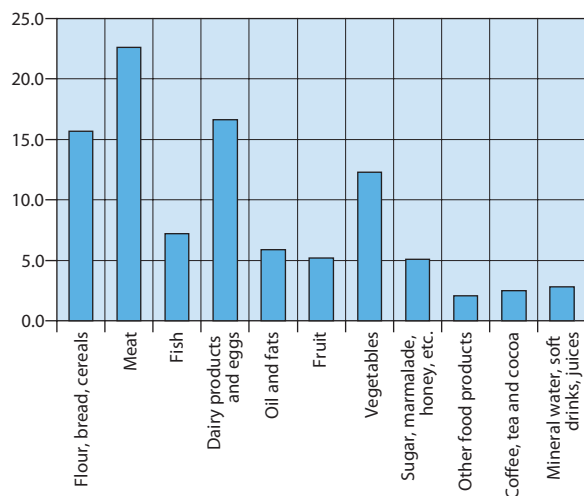

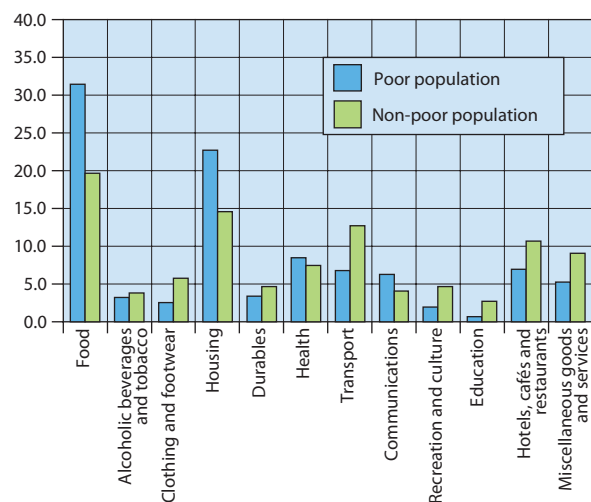

**Percentage distribution of average monthly purchases by poverty status, 2017**



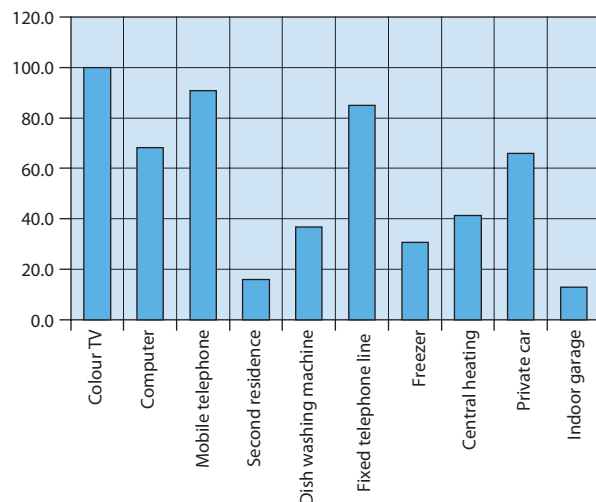

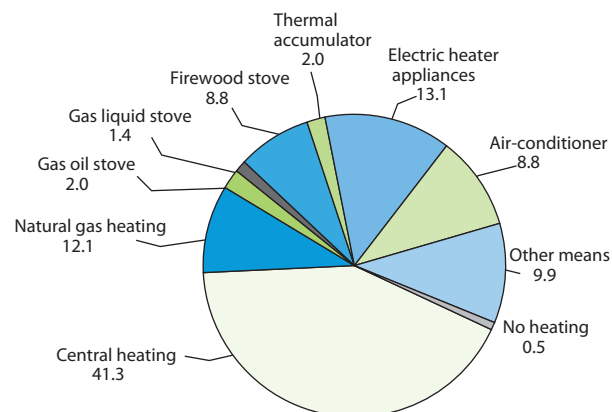

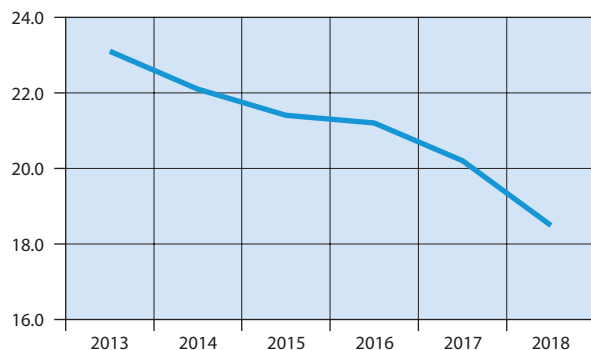

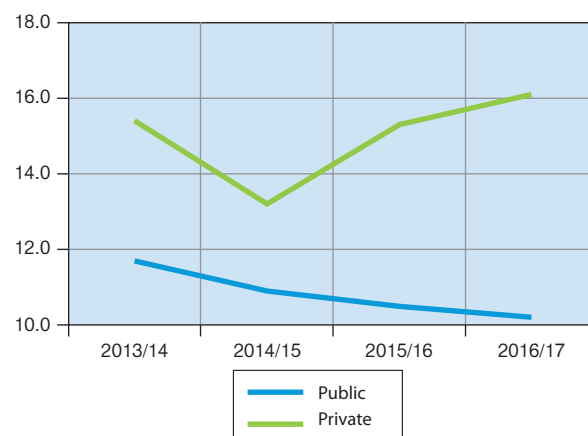

**Pupils per kindergartner (kindergartens)**

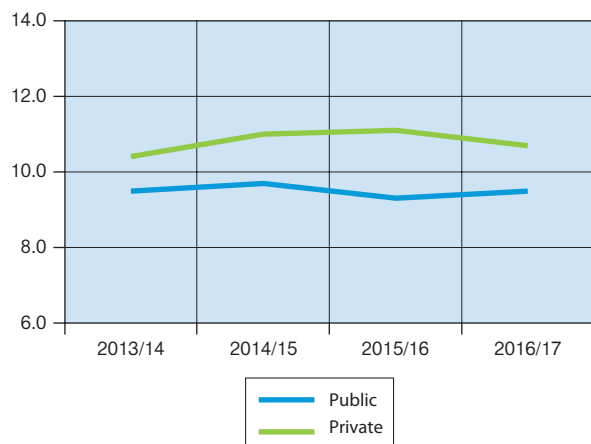

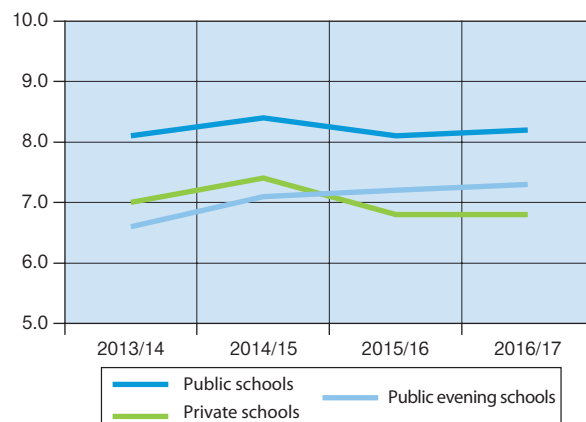

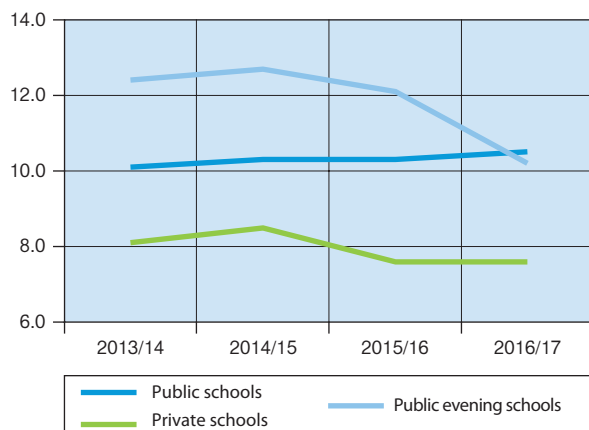

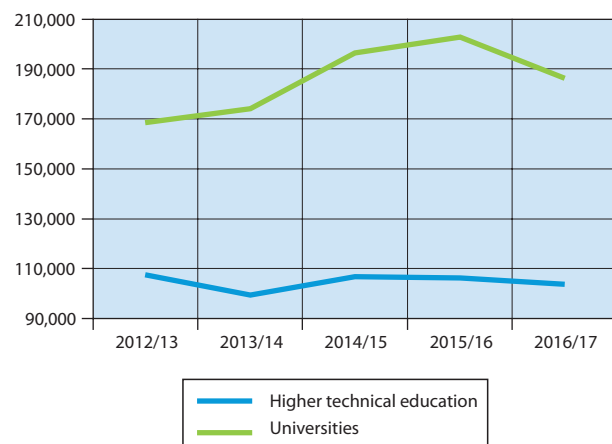

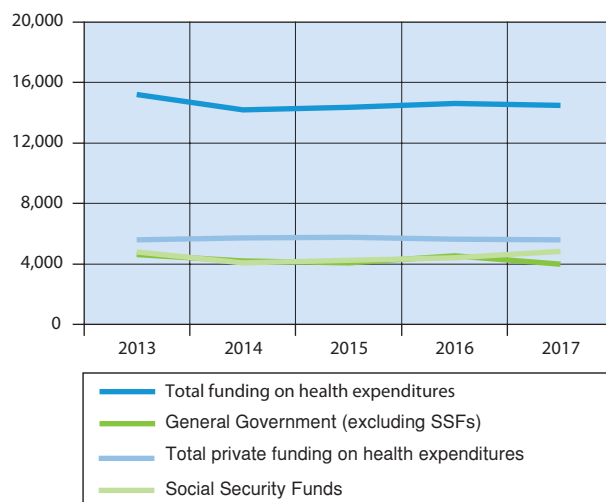

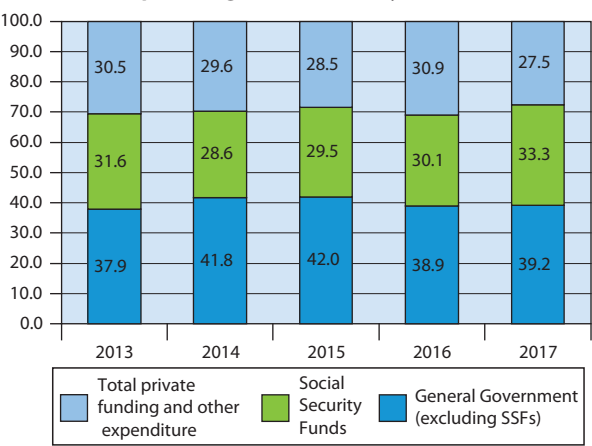

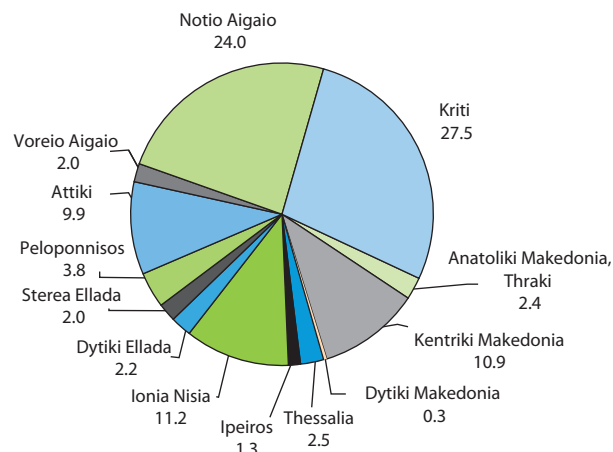

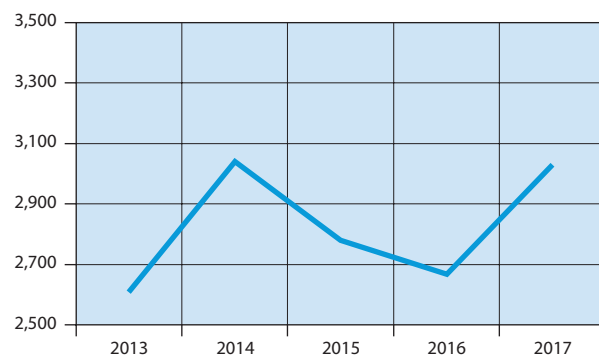

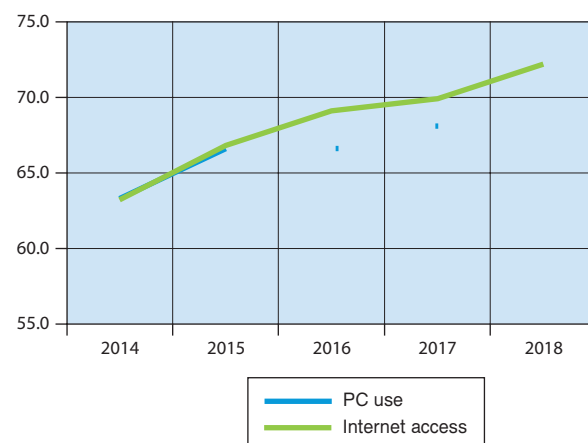

**Percentage of population making use of PC and having internet access**




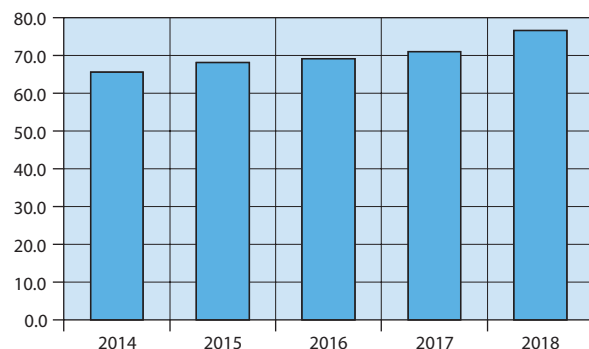

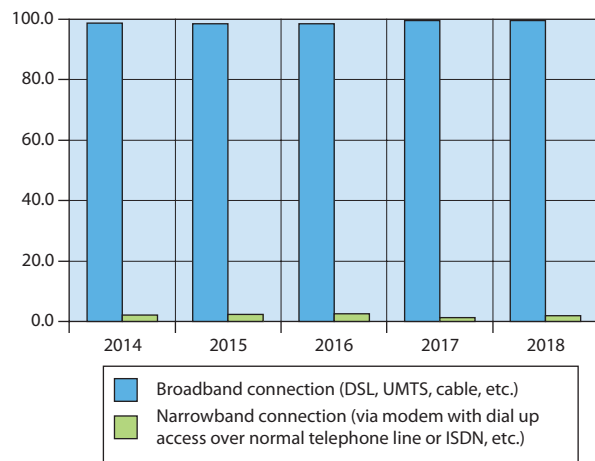

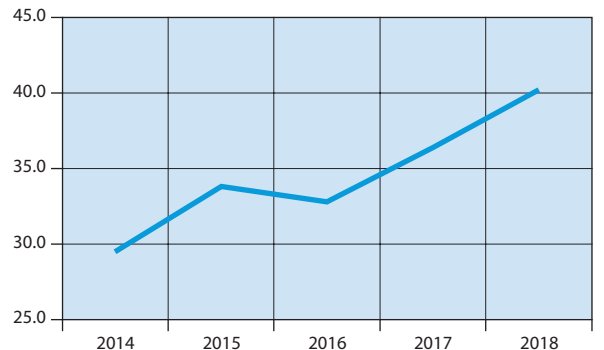

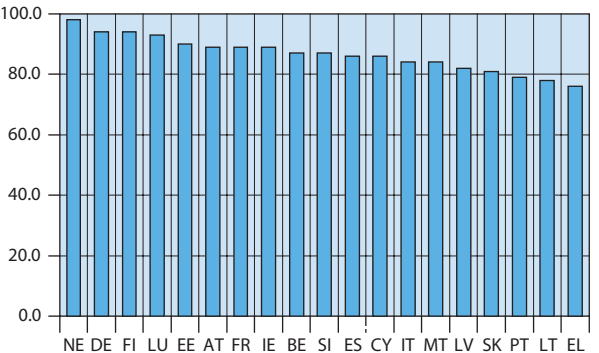
