#### LABOUR FORCE SURVEY 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2007

The General Secretariat of National Statistical Service of Greece announces the Labour Force Survey's results for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2007. Greek Labour Force Survey is harmonized with Commission's Regulation? 577/98.

Labour Force Survey is a sample survey. Sample design was based on the 2001 Census results. A two stage-sampling scheme is used for sample selection, with "areas" (that is, one or more groups of building blocks) serving as primary sampling units, and dwellings as secondary sampling units. 2,640 primary sampling units are selected through out whole Greece, and the total number of interviewed households was 30,651 (about 0.73% of the total number of households).

Survey characteristics (number of employed, unemployed etc.) were estimated by an unbiased estimator, which was calculated by taking into consideration: a) the probability of selection of a household, b) the non response rate in each primary sampling unit and c) and the estimated population distribution by sex and group ages in every NUT II level area, for the 2<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2007. The estimation of population distribution was based on population trends by sex and group ages and on the number of births, deaths and immigrants.

#### CHANGES IN UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AND IN LABOUR FORCE

During the 2nd Quarter of 2007 the unemployment rate (that is, the percentage of unemployed persons over the labour force, which is the sum of employed and unemployed persons) was 8.1%. During the corresponding quarter of 2006, unemployment rate was 8.8%. That percentage of 8.1% is the lowest unemployment rate for the first quarter of all the years since 1998 when Labour Force Survey started to be conducted every three months (Table 1).



During the  $2^{nd}$  quarter of 2007, the percentage of labour force over population aged 15 years old and over is 53.4%

#### I. UNEMPLOYMENT CHARACTERISTICS

Females' unemployment rate (12.6%) is still more than double of males' unemployment rate (5.0%).



#### Chart 1

By observing the unemployment rate for different age groups, we see that the highest unemployment rate is found among young people aged 15-29 years old (17.8%). Especially for young females, the unemployment rate is 23.6% (Table 2).

Considering educational level, unemployment rate is higher than the total rate for persons who have not attended school (9.6%) and those who have completed programs of ISCED 5b level (10.1%) and ISCED 3 level (8.9%) and , while is lower for persons who have completed programs of ISCED 5A (5.8%) and ISCED 1 level (6.9%) and for those who have not completed ISCED 1 level (5.4%) (Table 3).

The number of unemployed persons is estimated at 398,006. The 88.5% of the unemployed persons are looking for a full time job. In particular, 38.5% of unemployed is looking for a full time job only, while 50.0% is looking for full time job, but, if needed, would accept to work part time.

A significant part of the unemployed persons (12.9%) denied an offer for job for various reasons. Main reasons for denial were a) the place of job was not suitable (24.3%) b) wage was not satisfactory (20.4%) and c) working hours were not convenient (15.7%).

The percentage of "new" unemployed, who are persons that entered for the first time into labour market, is 35.2%. We must note that the percentage of "long term" unemployed, that is the percentage of persons that were looking for a job for more than 1 year (irrespectively of being "new" or "old" unemployed), is 52.3%.

Unemployment rate for persons of foreign nationality is almost equal to the mean "national" rate (8.0% compared to 8.1%). On the other hand, the percentage of economically active persons with foreign nationality remains considerably higher than the corresponding mean "national" rate (71.3% compared to 53.4%).

Concerning differences in unemployment rates in different regions, we must note that the highest rate is observed in Dytiki Makedonia (11.6%) and in Ipeiros (10.1%). The lowest unemployment rates are observed in Kriti (4.2%) and in Notio Aigaio and Thessalia (7,2%) (Table 4).


#### **II. EMPLOYMENT CHARACTERISTICS**

#### The number of employed in 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2007 is estimated at 4,519,853 persons.


During  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2007, there were 95,624 persons who found a job, and who were unemployed one year ago. During the same period, 77,095 persons that were inactive the previous year got in to employment. In contrary, 70,180 persons who were working one year ago, during the  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2007 are unemployed and other 81,891 persons that were working, are now inactive. In addition, 72,365 persons who were inactive one year ago, during  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2007 got in labour market, and are searching for a job.

If we examine changes in employment by different sector of economic activity, we see that there was a decrease in employment in primary sector by 2.6%, compared to the  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2006. In contrary, during the same period, there was an increase in employment in secondary and tertiary sector, by 3.1% and 1.7%, respectively. In tertiary sector, the branches with the largest increase were the branch of Health (5.8%), the branch of other community, social and personal service activities (8.0%) and the branch of Hotels and Restaurants (5.6%). In secondary sector, the branch with the largest increase is the branch of Contraction (10.0%), while in primary sector, there is an increase in employment in the branch of Fishery (15.3%).

The percentage of part time employment is still low. Persons that are working part time are 5.8% of the total employed. 43.0% of part timers choose to work part time because they cannot find a full time job, while 12.0% choose part time job, because they are looking after children or incapacitated adults.







The percentage of employees is estimated at 64.1% and is still lower than the mean percentage of employees in European Union (about 80% of the total employed). Table 5 shows the number of employed by branch of economy from  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2006 to  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2007, while Table 6 shows, for the same period of time, the change in employment in different branches of economy, using as base (=100) the employment at  $1^{st}$  Quarter 2004. Table 7 presents employment by branch of economy and sex, for  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2006 and  $2^{nd}$  Quarter 2007, and Table 8 gives the allocation of employed in different branches of economy (as percentage) for the 13 NUT II regions of Greece.
