

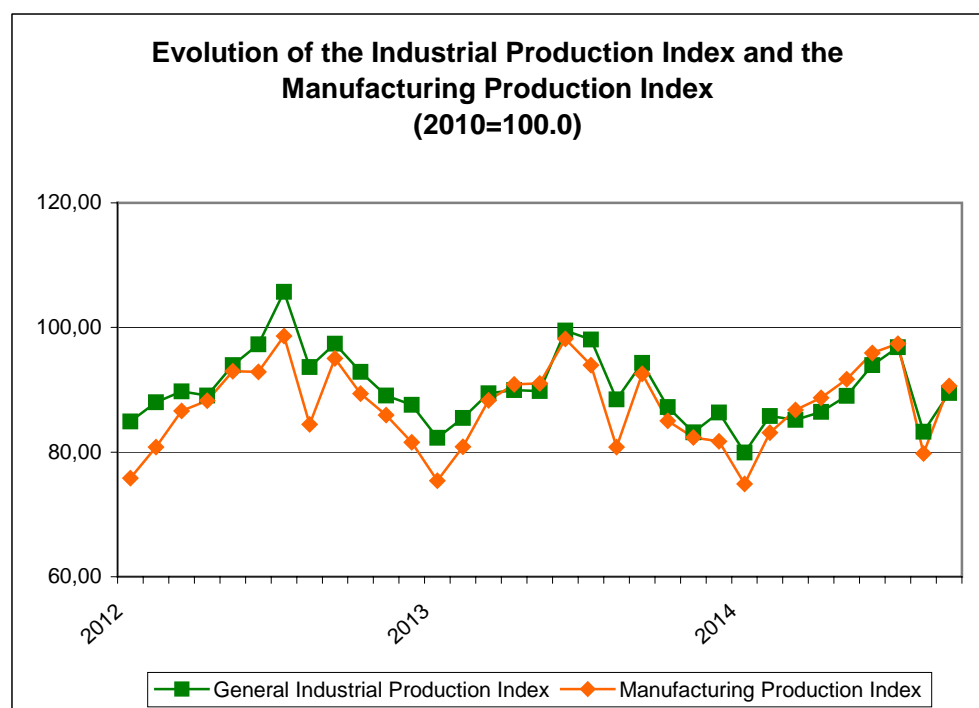


## PRESS RELEASE

### PRODUCTION INDEX IN INDUSTRY: September 2014

The Production Index in Industry (IPI) in September 2014 compared with September 2013 recorded a decline of 5.1%. In September 2013, the annual rate of change of the IPI was -3.2%.

In the 9-month period from January 2014 to September 2014, the average rate of change of the IPI was -3.4%. In September 2013, the corresponding average rate of change of the IPI was -2.7%.

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## **1. Annual rates of change of September 2014 compared with September 2013.**

The IPI in September 2014, compared with September 2013, decreased by 5.1% due to the annual changes of the sub-indices of the industrial sections:

- a. Mining and quarrying production decreased by 5.7%.
- b. Manufacturing production decreased by 2.1%.
- c. Electricity production decreased by 15.2%.
- d. Water supply production decreased by 3.2%.

## **2. Average rates of change of the period January - September 2014 compared with January - September 2013.**

The IPI in the 9-month period January – September 2014, compared with the period January – September 2013, decreased by 3.4% due to the 9-month average rates of change of the sub-indices of the industrial sections:

- a. Mining and quarrying production decreased by 0.1%.
- b. Manufacturing production decreased by 0.4%.
- c. Electricity production decreased by 13.4%.
- d. Water supply production decreased by 1.1%.

| <b>Purpose of the index</b>            | The IPI is an important business cycle indicator, which shows the monthly activity in the Mining-Quarrying, Manufacturing, Electricity and Water Supply sectors. A more specific object of the Industrial Production Index is to compare the magnitude (volume) of the current month's output at any given time with the corresponding figure for a given base period. The IPI shows the evolution of value added, at factor cost, of production, at constant prices.    |
| <b>Legal basis</b>                     | The compilation of IPI is governed by Council Regulation (EEC) No.1165/98 "concerning short-term statistics".
