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





Percentage distribution of Resident Population by gender and marital status



Distribution (%) of Resident Population by region



Resident Population by gender in the 10 largest **Municipalities of Greece**



Resident Population by citizenship group (%)







Total mortality rate: the number of deaths per 1,000 people.

Infant mortality rate: the number of children dying at less than 1 year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.








Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP




Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP







Annual rates of change (%)







Percentage distribution of the utilised agricultural area of the holdings, by basic categories of land use











Dispatches - Exports, including oil products (in bil. €)








Arrivals - Imports (in bil. €)












Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2019


Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2018


Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2018


Percentage distribution of average monthly purchases by poverty status, 2018


Housing amenities of households (%), 2018







Pupils per teacher (primary schools)





Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)







Percentage distribution of nights spent by Greek and foreign nationals in hotels and campsites, 2018







Percentage of population having internet access








Euro area countries: Percentage of households with interntet access at home, 2019
