





2021 Population - Housing Census





2021 Population - Housing Census





2021 Population - Housing Census









**Percentage distribution of households by size**









labour cost (y-o-y change %)**







**Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP**




**Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP**









**14. EU: Gross domestic product (GDP) per capita in purchasing power standards, 2018 - 2022**




**Euro area countries: General Government deficit/surplus as a percentage of GDP, 2022**









Arrivals - Imports (%), 2023






## Arrivals - Imports (in bil. €)





Population aged 15 years and over by employment status



Persons employed aged 15 years and over by main sector of the economy











### Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2022






Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2022


Percentage distribution of average monthly purchases by poverty status, 2022













**Pupils per teacher (primary schools)**



**Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)**



**Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)**




### Total funding on health expenditures (in mil. euro)










