



GREECE-RUSSIA AND GREECE-UKRAINE BILATERAL TRADE DATA JANUARY 2023 (Provisional data)


The Hellenic Statistical Authority (ELSTAT), responding to the need for the provision of specialized statistical information due to the ongoing developments linked to the war in Ukraine, announces bilateral trade data between Greece and Russian Federation (henceforth Russia) and between Greece and Ukraine.

The current Publication is issued on a monthly basis at preannounced dates during the whole period in which the publication of bilateral trade data is warranted and relevant in order to reflect the impact on the external trade transactions of the Greek enterprises with enterprises in Russia and in Ukraine.

I. BILATERAL TRADE GREECE-RUSSIA

In January 2023 the value of imports of Greece from Russia was 498.0 million euros, recording a decrease of 0.1% in comparison with January 2022 when it was 498.7 million euros. The value of exports of Greece to Russia in January 2023 was 9.6 million euros, recording a decrease of 40.3% in comparison with January 2022 when it was 16.0 million euros. The trade balance between Greece-Russia in January 2023 was negative and amounted to 488.4 million euros (deficit) (Table 1).

In 2022, 397¹ Greek enterprises had imports from Russia and 404 Greek enterprises had exports to Russia.

The total value of imports of Greece from Russia in 2022 was 9,334.1 million euros, recording an increase 117.0% in comparison with the respective total value of the year 2021 when it was 4,302.4 million euros (Table 2).

The total value of exports of Greece to Russia in 2022 was 156.4 million euros recording a decrease of 24.3% in comparison with the corresponding total value of the year 2021 when it was 206.6 million euros (Table 2).

The trade balance between Greece and Russia in year 2022 was negative and amounted to 9,177.7 million euros (deficit) (Table 2).

II. BILATERAL TRADE GREECE-UKRAINE

In January 2023 the value of imports of Greece from Ukraine was 31.9 million euros, recording an increase of 66.9% in comparison with January 2022 when it was 19.1 million euros. The value of exports of Greece to Ukraine in January 2023 was 96.1 million euros, recording an increase of 523.4% in comparison with January 2022 when it was 15.4 million euros. The trade balance between Greece-Ukraine in January 2023 was positive and amounted to 64.2 million euros (surplus) (Table 5).

In 2022, 387 Greek enterprises had imports from Ukraine and 473 Greek enterprises had exports to Ukraine.

The total value of imports of Greece from Ukraine in 2022 was 280.5 million euros, recording an increase 41.4% in comparison with the corresponding total value in 2021 when it was 198.4 million euros (Table 6).

The total value of exports of Greece to Ukraine in 2022 was 343.2 million euros recording an increase of 1.3% in comparison with the respective total value in year 2021 when it was 338.8 million euros (Table 6).

The trade balance between Greece and Ukraine in 2022 was positive and amounted to 62.7 million euros (surplus) (Table 6).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

General

The Commercial Transactions are recorded on a monthly basis aiming at monitoring the total value of imports and exports as well as their changes. This recording does not include the imports and exports of services.

Legal framework

The survey is conducted for trade with third countries (Extrastat) in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2152/2019 and (EU) 1197/2020.

Reference period

January 2023

Provision of results

38 days after the end of the reference month (provisional data). The provisional data are revised and disseminated on a monthly basis for all the previous months until the finalization of the yearly data, which takes place ten months after the end of the reference year.

Definitions

EXTRASTAT is the system for collecting external trade data with third countries (countries outside the EU).

Import is considered every import of goods from a third country (outside the EU). **Export** is considered every export of goods to a third country (outside the EU).

Methodology

EXTRASTAT: It is a statistical survey where data are collected by administrative sources. The Customs Authorities collect the relevant statistical data on trade by filling in the Single Administrative Document (SAD). All the transactions with third countries above the amount of 1,000 euros are registered. In the beginning of each month Customs Authorities transmit to the Hellenic Statistical Authority an electronic file with the customs data of statistical relevance of the previous month.

The statistical data of imports and exports of goods with the Third Countries are derived from the data transmitted by the Customs Authorities.

Henceforth, the provisional data from the "incomplete customs declarations" -which concern mainly petroleum products- are incorporated in the monthly data on trade with third countries; the "incomplete customs declarations" data after having been completed will be replaced by the final data.

Classification of goods: The goods are classified in compliance with the 8-digit Combined Nomenclature Code (CN/8) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC).
