

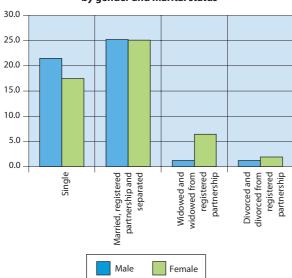





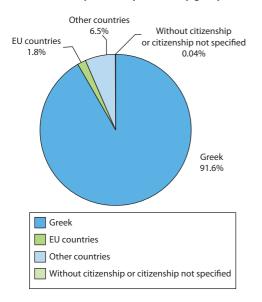
Resident Population by gender in the 10 largest Municipalities of Greece

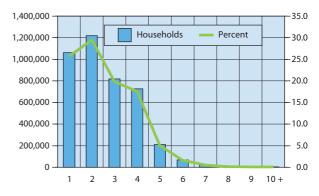

Resident Population by citizenship group





Infant mortality rate: The number of children dying at less than a year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.










Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP




Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP



























Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2014






Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2014

Percentage distribution of average monthly purchases by poverty status, 2014






Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)






