


#### Age groups: population and percent share by gender

## Percentage distribution of Resident Population by gender and marital status



#### **Distribution of Resident Population by region**



#### Resident Population by gender in the 10 largest **Municipalities of Greece**





#### **Resident Population by citizenship group**







Infant mortality rate: The number of children dying at less than a year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.










#### Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP




#### Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP







#### Euro area countries: HICP - Annual average rate of change, 2014






















### Exports - Dispatches (in bil. €)


### Population aged 15 years and over, by employment status






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

### Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2014




# Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2014


### Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2014

### Percentage distribution of average monthly purchases by poverty status, 2014





# Percentage distribution of households by main heating means, 2014



## Euro area countries: People at-risk-of-poverty or social exclusion, 2013









#### Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)













#### Percentage distribution of nights spent by Greek and foreign nationals in hotels and campsites, 2013














