
FOREWORD




Age groups: population and percent share by gender

Percentage distribution of Resident Population by gender and marital status






Distribution of Resident Population by region

Resident Population by gender in the 10 largest Municipalities of Greece





Resident Population by citizenship group


Households by size


Infant mortality rate: The number of children dying at less than a year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.


Marriages by type








Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP




Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP










Euro area countries: General Government deficit/surplus as % of GDP, 2014














Population aged 15 years and over, by employment status












Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2014

Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2014













Pupils per kindergartner (kindergartens)



Pupils per teacher (primary schools)



Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)










Total funding on health expenditures by financing agency











Percentage of population making use of PC and having internet access






Percentage of population having bought / ordered goods or services over the internet


