

PRESS RELEASE GREECE-RUSSIA AND GREECE-UKRAINE BILATERAL TRADE DATA SEPTEMBER 2022 (Provisional data)

The Hellenic Statistical Authority (ELSTAT), responding to the need for the provision of specialized statistical information due to the ongoing developments linked to the war in Ukraine, announces bilateral trade data between Greece and Russian Federation (henceforth Russia) and between Greece and Ukraine.

The current Press Release is issued on a monthly basis at preannounced dates during the whole period in which the publication of bilateral trade data is warranted and relevant in order to reflect the impact on the external trade transactions of the Greek enterprises with enterprises in Russia and in Ukraine.

I. BILATERAL TRADE GREECE-RUSSIA

In September 2022 the value of imports of Greece from Russia was 1,102.2 million euros, recording an increase of 265.1% in comparison with September 2021 when it was 301.9 million euros. The value of exports of Greece to Russia in September 2022 was 14.9 million euros, recording a decrease of 31.9% in comparison with September 2021 when it was 21.9 million euros. The trade balance between Greece-Russia in September 2022 was negative and amounted to 1,087.3 million euros (deficit), (Table 1).

During the period January-September 2022 the value of imports of Greece from Russia was 6,831.3 million euros, recording an increase of 151.6% in comparison with the period January-September 2021 when it was 2,715.1 million euros. The value of exports of Greece to Russia during the period January-September 2022 was 92.9 million euros, recording a decrease of 33.5% in comparison with the period January-September 2021 when it was 139.7 million euros. The trade balance between Greece-Russia during the period January-September 2022 was negative and amounted to 6,738.4 million euros (deficit), (Table 2).

In 2021, 655 Greek enterprises had imports from Russia and 639 Greek enterprises had exports to Russia.

The total value of imports of Greece from Russia in 2021 was 4,302.4 million euros, recording an increase 46.7% in comparison with the respective total value of the year 2020 when it was 2,933.5 million euros (Table 3).

The total value of exports of Greece to Russia in 2021 was 206.6 million euros recording an increase of 28.0% in comparison with the corresponding total value of the year 2020 when it was 161.4 million euros (Table 3).

The trade balance between Greece and Russia in year 2021 was negative and amounted to 4,095.8 million euros (deficit), (Table 3).

II. BILATERAL TRADE GREECE-UKRAINE

In September 2022 the value of imports of Greece from Ukraine was 31.6 million euros, recording an increase of 234.9% in comparison with September 2021 when it was 9.4 million euros. The value of exports of Greece to Ukraine in September 2022 was 18.9 million euros, recording a decrease of 57.7% in comparison with September 2021 when it was 44.7 million euros. The trade balance between Greece-Ukraine in September 2022 was negative and amounted to 12.7 million euros (deficit), (Table 6).

During the period January-September 2022 the value of imports of Greece from Ukraine was 132.6 million euros, recording an increase of 2.1% in comparison with the period January-September 2021 when it was 129.9 million euros. The value of exports of Greece to Ukraine during the period January-September 2022 was 223.0 million euros, recording a decrease of 4.7% in comparison with the period January-September 2021 when it was 234.0 million euros. The trade balance between Greece-Ukraine during the period January-September 2022 was positive and amounted to 90.4 million euros (surplus), (Table 7).

In 2021, 494 Greek enterprises had imports from Ukraine and 581 Greek enterprises had exports to Ukraine.

The total value of imports of Greece from Ukraine in 2021 was 198.4 million euros, recording an increase 10.8% in comparison with the corresponding total value in 2020 when it was 179.0 million euros (Table 8).

The total value of exports of Greece to Ukraine in 2021 was 338.8 million euros recording an increase of 74.9% in comparison with the respective total value in year 2020 when it was 193.7 million euros (Table 8).

The trade balance between Greece and Ukraine in 2021 was positive and amounted to 140.4 million euros (surplus), (Table 8).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

General

The Commercial Transactions are recorded on a monthly basis aiming at monitoring the total value of imports and exports as well as their changes. This recording does not include the imports and exports of services.

Legal framework

The survey is conducted for trade with third countries (Extrastat) in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2152/2019 and (EU) 1197/2020.

Reference period

September 2022

Provision of results

38 days after the end of the reference month (provisional data). The provisional data are revised and disseminated on a monthly basis for all the previous months until the finalization of the yearly data, which takes place ten months after the end of the reference year.

Definitions

EXTRASTAT is the system for collecting external trade data with third countries (countries outside the EU).

Import is considered every import of goods from a third country (outside the EU). **Export** is considered every export of goods to a third country (outside the EU).

Methodology

EXTRASTAT: It is a statistical survey where data are collected by administrative sources, The Customs Authorities collect the relevant statistical data on trade by filling in the Single Administrative Document (SAD). All the transactions with third countries above the amount of 1,000 euros are registered. In the beginning of each month Customs Authorities transmit to the Hellenic Statistical Authority an electronic file with the customs data of statistical relevance of the previous month.

The statistical data of imports and exports of goods with the Third Countries are derived from the data transmitted by the Customs Authorities.

Henceforth, the provisional data from the "incomplete customs declarations" - which concern mainly petroleum products - are incorporated in the monthly data on trade with third countries; the "incomplete customs declarations" data after having been completed will be replaced by the final data.

Classification of goods: The goods are classified in compliance with the 8-digit Combined Nomenclature Code (CN/8) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC).
