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## PRESS RELEASE

### SHORT-TERM INDICES OF EMPLOYMENT, HOURS WORKED AND GROSS WAGES AND SALARIES

#### IN MAIN SECTIONS OF THE ECONOMY

1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2010 – 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2015

The Hellenic Statistical Authority (ELSTAT), in the framework of the programme to enhance the availability of its statistics, is publishing for the first time a new quarterly Press Release, aiming at presenting data on the evolution of Short-Term Indices of Employment, Hours Worked and Gross Wages and Salaries in main sections of the economy. This Press Release includes data concerning the period from the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2010 to the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2015.

The survey on the compilation of Short-Term Indices of Employment, Hours Worked and Gross Wages and Salaries is part of the European Labour Market Statistics and it is conducted on the grounds of Regulations (EC) No 1165/1998 and (EC) No 1503/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council.

The evolution of the of Short-Term Indices of Employment, Hours Worked and Gross Wages and Salaries in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2015 in comparison to the corresponding indices in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2014 is as follows:

The following tables present analytically the unadjusted (not seasonally adjusted and not adjusted for the number of working days) Indices of Employment, Hours Worked and Gross Wages and Salaries for ten main sections of economic activities of NACE Rev. 2, namely for B - E (Mining-Quarrying and Industry), F (Construction), H-J and M-N (Other Services). The abovementioned indices are presented by quarter for the period 2010 – 2015. Furthermore, data are presented on the annual rate of change between the corresponding quarters for each Nace Rev.2 Section (Table 1: Q1, Table 2: Q2, Table 3: Q3 and Table 4: Q4).

Graphs 1- 10 depict the evolution over time of the Indices of Employment, Hours Worked and Gross Wages and Salaries broken down by Nace Rev.2 Section for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of the years 2010 - 2015.

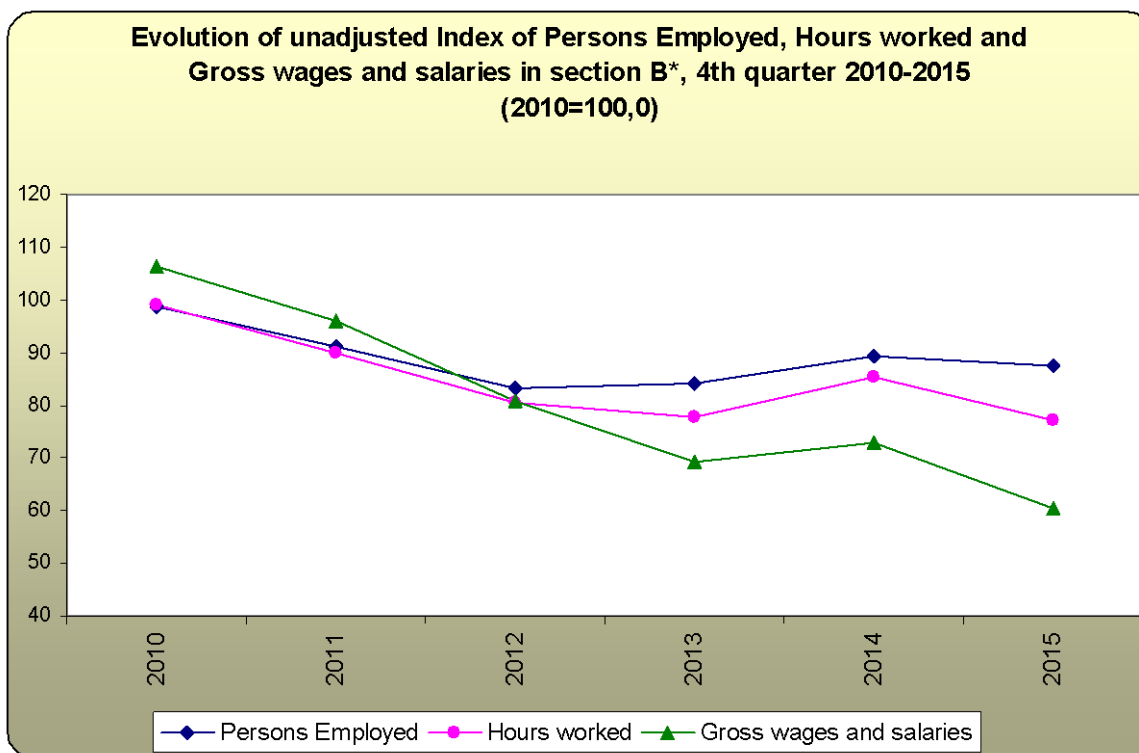

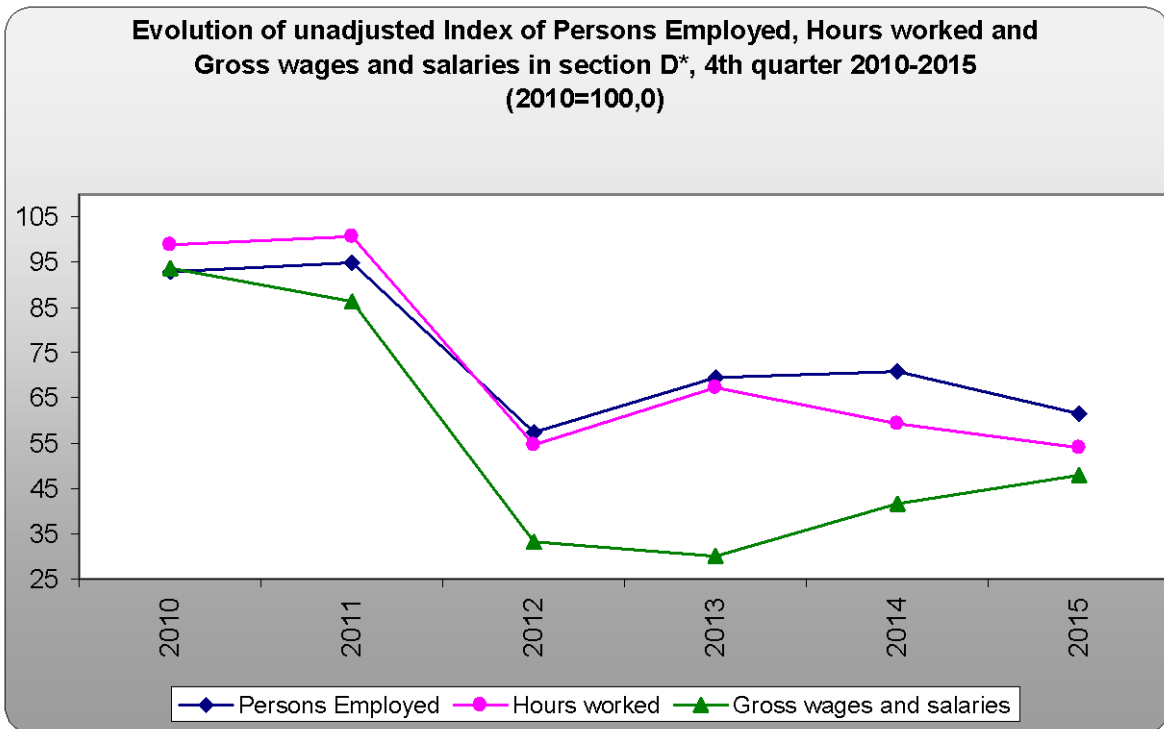

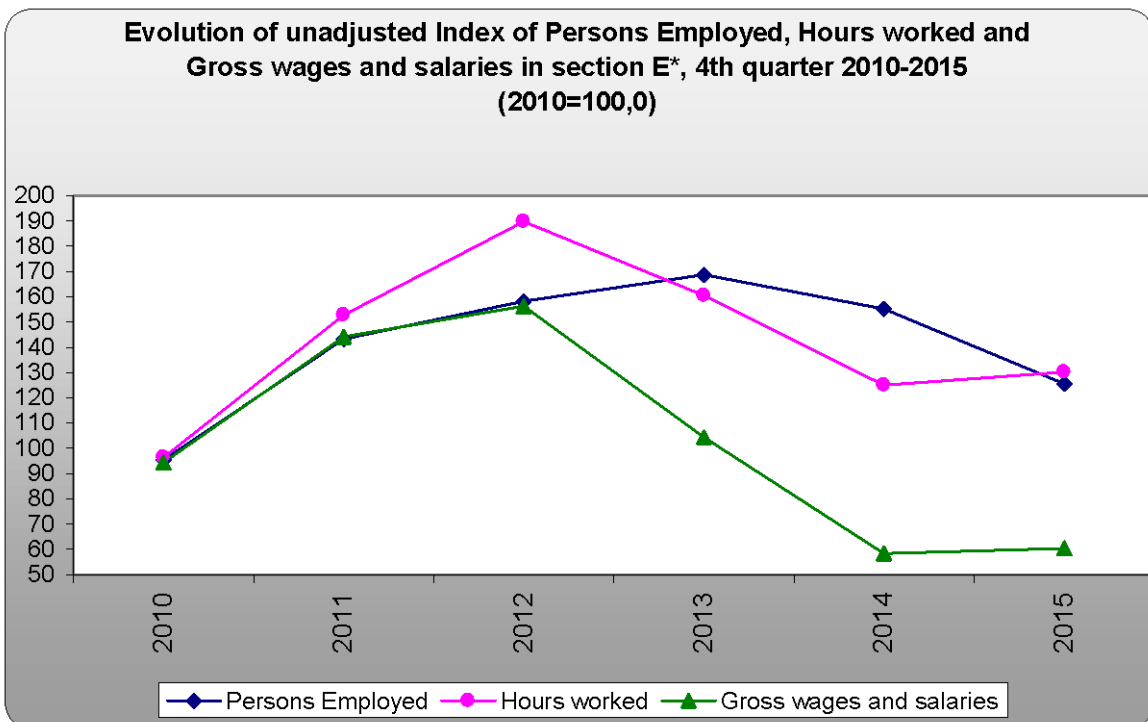

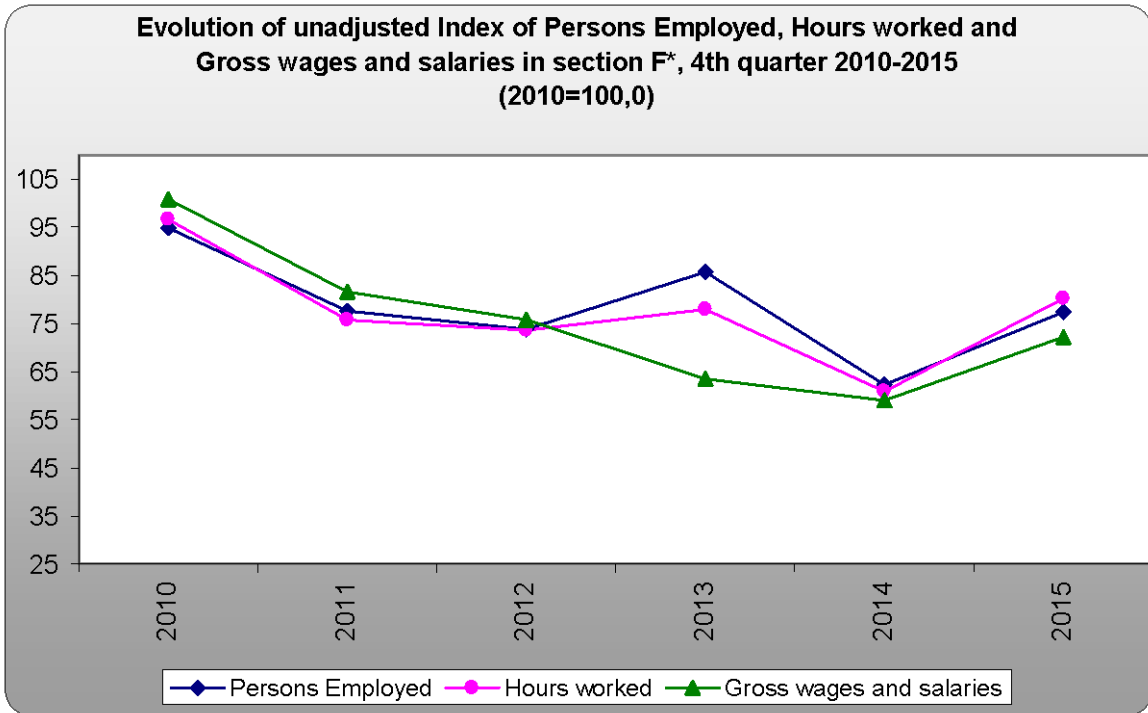
\* Economic activity Nace Rev.2, Section D: Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply

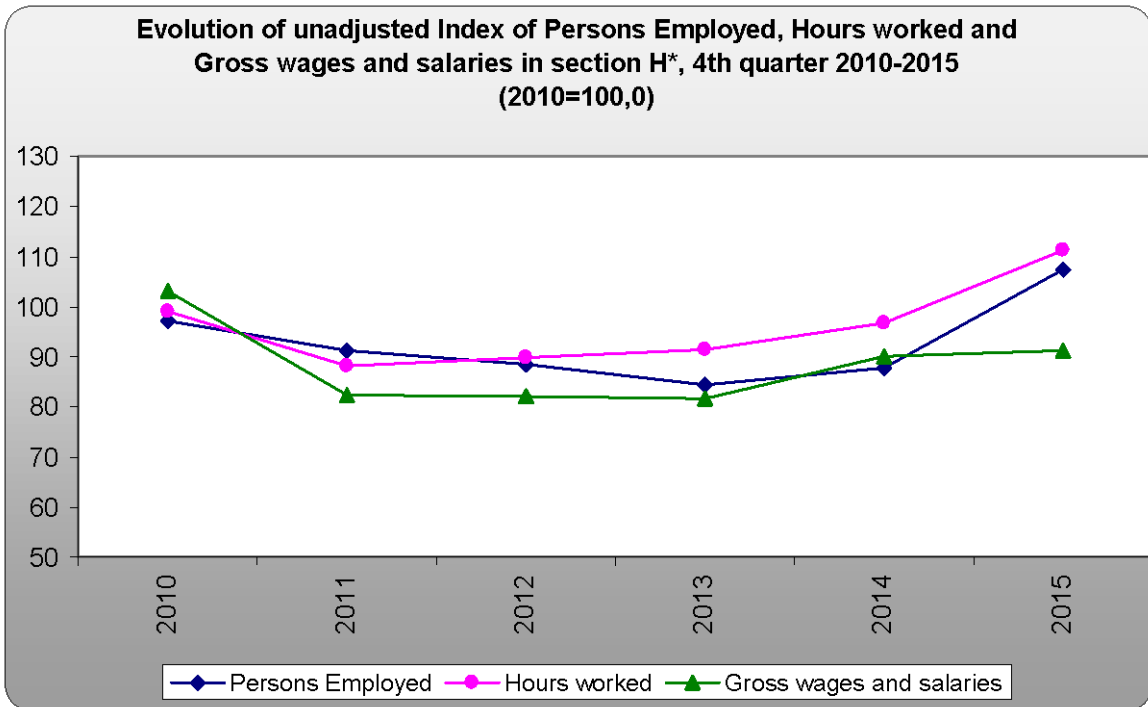

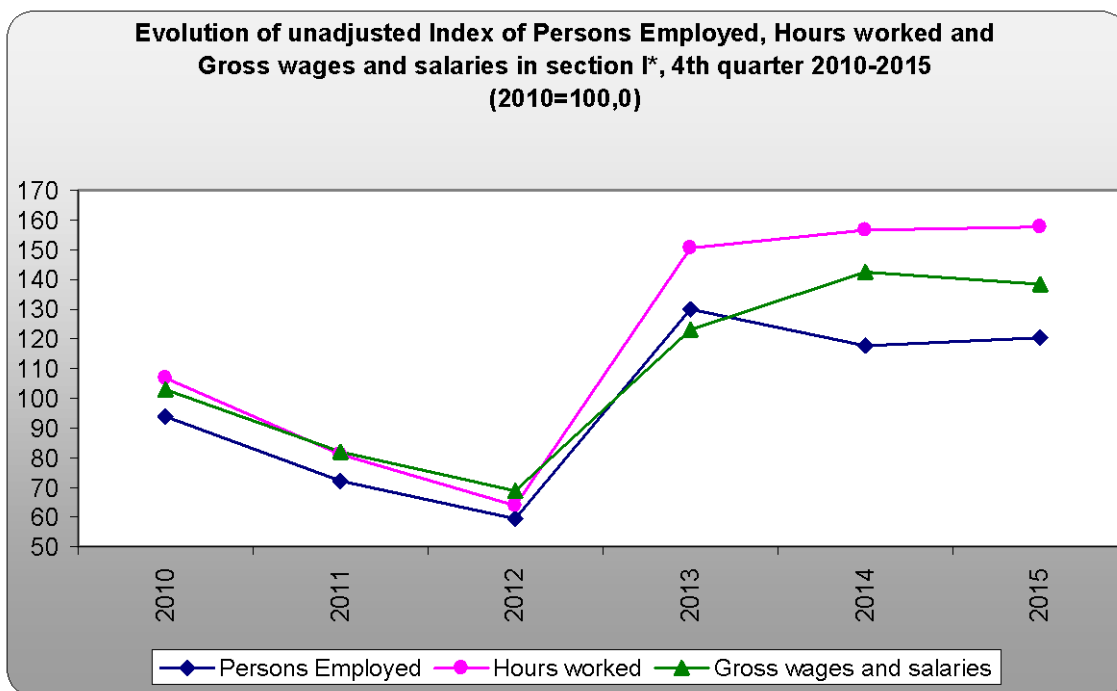

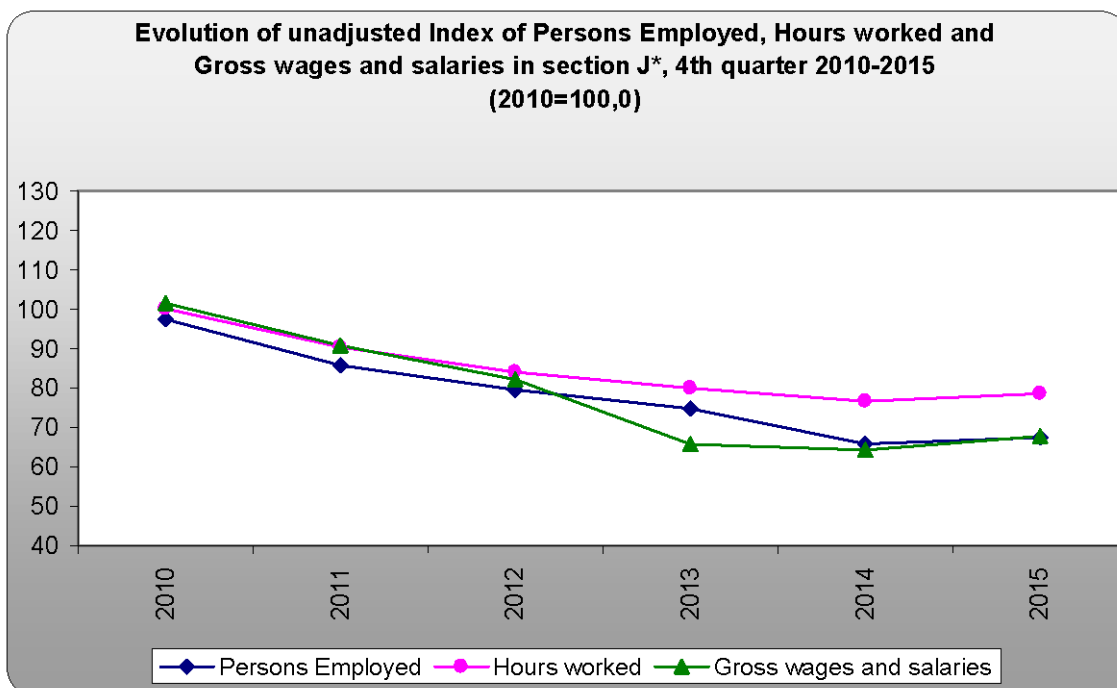

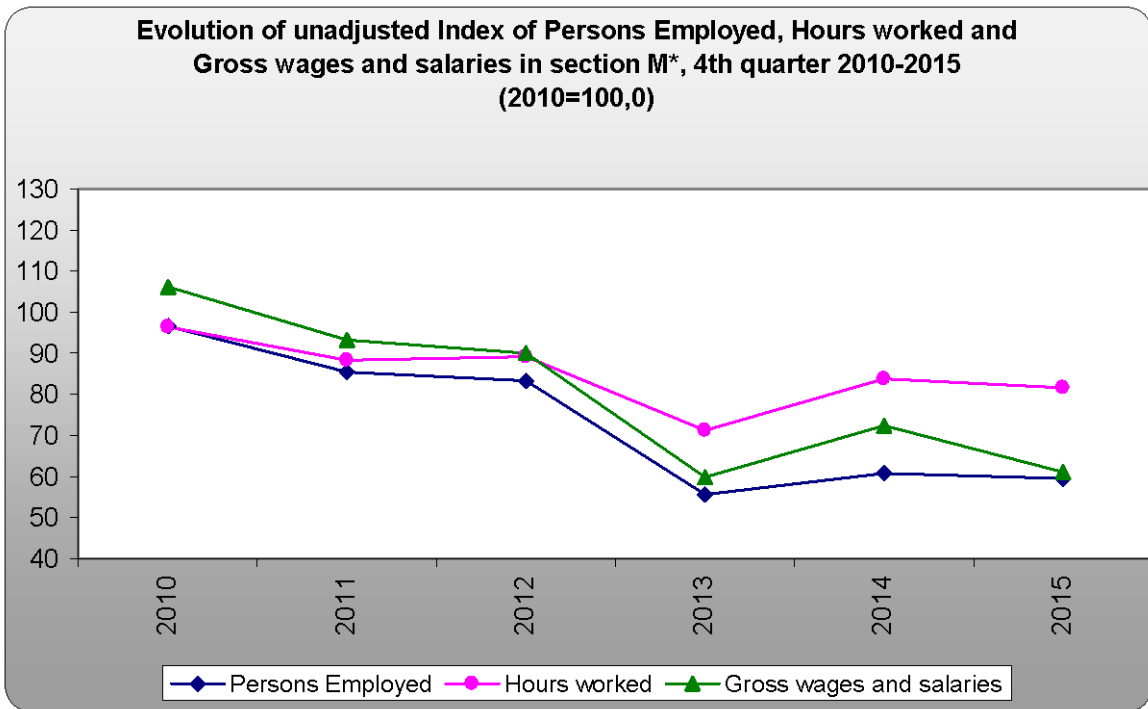
\* Economic activity Nace Rev.2, Section I: Accommodation and Food Service Activities

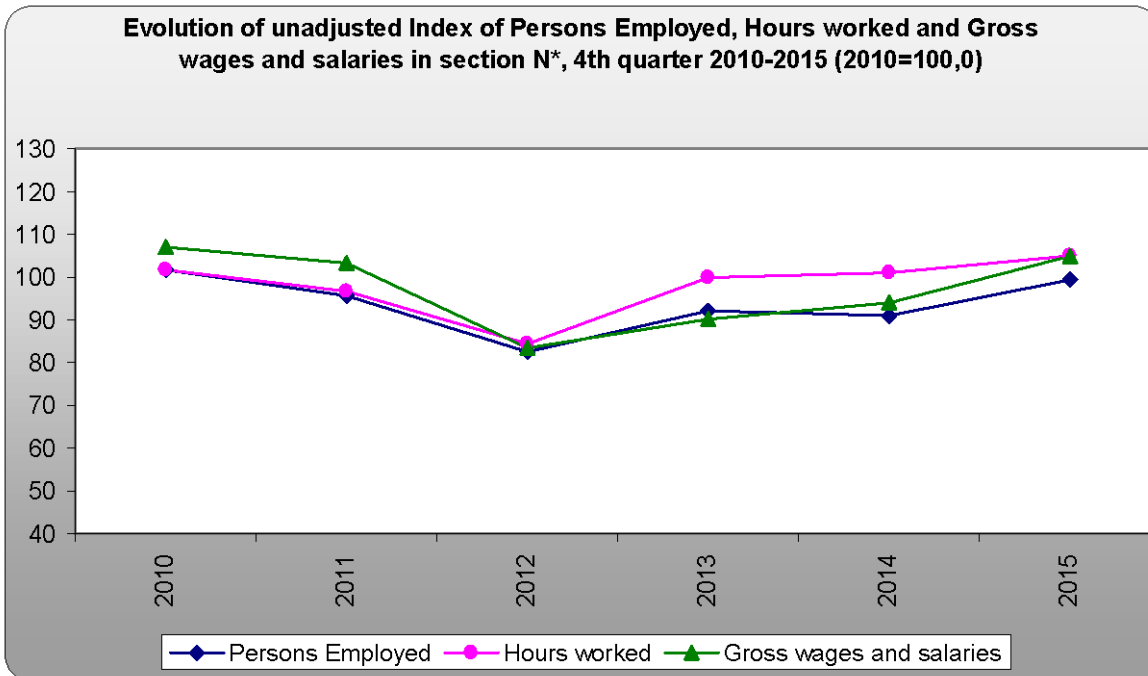

<b>Generally</b>	The Short-term Indices of Persons Employed, Hours worked and Gross wages and salaries are quarterly indices concerning the Sections of economic activity B to E (Industry), F (Construction), H-J and M-N (Other Services) of the European economic classification NACE Rev.2, having 2010 as the base year (2010=100,00).	
<b>Purpose of the index – Definitions</b>	<p>The purpose of the indices is the description in change of Persons Employed, Hours worked and Gross wages and salaries on a quarterly basis in sections of economic activity B to E (Industry), F (Construction), H-J and M-N (Other Services) of the European economic classification NACE Rev.2.</p> <p>As <b>Number of Persons Employed</b> is defined the total number of persons employed in the enterprise, irrespectively of their status (owners, partners and their family members) and the nature of their work (managers, sales persons and auxiliary staff) and irrespectively of whether they work temporarily or seasonally, full-time or part-time employment, with or without remuneration.</p> <p>As <b>Hours Worked</b> is defined the total number of hours actually worked in the enterprise during the reference quarter. Included are hours actually worked during normal working hours; hours worked in addition to those, with or without remuneration, time that is spent at the place of work on tasks such as preparing the site and time corresponding to short periods of rest at the work place. This variable excludes hours paid but not actually worked such as for annual leave, holidays and sickness leave.</p> <p>As <b>Wages and salaries</b> is defined the total remuneration, in cash or in kind, payable to all persons counted on the payroll, in return for work done.</p>	
<b>Legal Framework</b>	<p>The Short-term Indices of Persons Employed, Hours worked and Gross wages and salaries are compiled in the framework defined by the Council Regulation (EC) No.1165/98 concerning short-term statistics and on Council Regulation (EC) No.1503/2006 as regards definitions of variables, list of variables and frequency of data compilation.</p> <p>The abovementioned indices are implementing the Regulation (EC) No.1893/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing the statistical classification of economic activities NACE Rev.2.</p>
