	Foreign trade with EU-countries is based on information obtained by Intrastat declarations. Only VAT liable establishments with EU-imports of more than €29,000 and EU-exports of more than €44,000 are obliged to provide data. Foreign trade with non-EU countries is based on customs records received by Customs Offices. There is no threshold for imports. A threshold of 88 Euros exists for exports. Data are available at Customs House level.					
	Intra trade is the Greece's total merchandise trade within the EU-countries. Extra trade is the total merchandise trade with countries who are not members of the EU.					
	The data are released at the 8-digit level of the Combined Nomenclature.					
	Data of the years previous to the introduction of Euro (2002) are published in million drachmae (national currency) and US dollars. Comparisons of 2002 with the previous years in Euros.					
	External Trade Indices (1991=100): For general indices, by 2-digit group (half-yearly) and 1-digit section of the SITC Rev. 3; by country of origin and destination, for the EU and the main third countries, by 1-digit section of the SITC Rev 3. The data are not seasonally adjusted.

	The data on Merchandise Trade are disseminated by the NSSG as a service to the public. Summary Methodology Page

I. Analytical framework, concepts, definitions, and classifications (including reference to applicable guidelines)

- Definition: Import and export statistics refer to (a) trade with countries belonging to European Community; and, (b) trade with other countries, exports and imports considered as goods exiting or entering the borders.
- Classification: The classifications used are the Combined Nomenclature, 8level (CN8) developed for national purposes for Extra trade and the SITC Rev 3. Country coding is the alphabetic ISO 2digit level adopted by the European Union.
- International, regional guidelines: Foreign trade statistics follow European Community regulations. A distinction has to be made between the trade with EU-Member States (Intrastat system) and trade with non EU-Member States.

II. Scope of the data (coverage of, e.g., institutional units, transactions and stock, commodities, industries, and geographic areas)

- Transactions coverage: For Extra Trade transactions below €88 Euros are excluded, because of their low value. For EU trade no data collected for transactions of individuals and enterprises under the statistical threshold (€29,000 Euros for acquisitions and €44,000 Euros for deliveries). Certain goods for confidentiality reasons are recorded under a special commodity category ("other commodities").
- Geographic coverage: All merchandise trade between Greece and the rest of the world is included.
- Unrecorded activity: No estimates are made.

III. Accounting conventions (e.g. time of recording, valuation methods)

- Conversion to unit of account: Data are converted into Euro (€), from the year 2002. For the previous years the valuation is in million Drachmae.
- Valuation: For imports the CIF value is used. For exports the FOB value is used.

IV. Nature of the basic data (e.g., administrative records, surveys censuses, combinations of these)

- Sources: For Extra Trade, the source is the customs tariff (SAD) document. For Intra trade, the source is the INTRASTAT declaration made by the trader
- Type of data collected: Goods classified CN 8digit; countries of origin/destination; quantity (net weight and/or units); value in national currency; nature of transaction; national region of origin/destination; mode of transport; and delivery terms (CIF, FOB, etc).
- Basis of country data: For Extra trade country of origin/destination. For Intra trade country of consignment and destination.

V. Compilation practices (e.g., weighting schemes, imputation methods, balancing/cross-checking techniques)

- Adjustments to improve coverage/classifications/timing/valuation: There are no adjustments. The processing system checks for errors in the commodity code, the country code and many other data items in order to obtain accurate results.
- Processing system: National automated system.
- Processing site: For Extra Trade Customs Offices collect the data. The 78% of the data are sent on line to the Central Computer of the Ministry of Finance. The rest 22% of the data in printed form are sent for data-entry to the Informatics center of the Ministry of Finance. After that the whole data sent to the Central Computer of the NSSG. For Intra trade Tax Offices collect the data. The 70% of the

data in printed form are sent to NSSG for data-entry. The rest of 30% of the data are submitted to the NSSG by the traders through IDEP/CN8. Gradually the electronic tracing for data collection will be brought into general use. The whole process is controlled by the NSSG, who compiles and publishes the statistics.

- Timing of recording transactions: Time of clearance, for Third Country Trade. For Intra EC trade, all transactions of every trader in one month (the calendar month in which the VAT is due).
- Reconciliation: For Third Countries Trade reconciliation is undertaken between Customs offices and importers/exporters and for Intra EC trade between Tax offices and intra EU traders.

VI. Other aspects (e.g., seasonal adjustment, disclosure avoidance, base years, reference years, transformations from fiscal to calendar years)

- Seasonal adjustment: No seasonal adjustment is made.
- Geographic detail: Published information is available by country and major country groups
- Commodity detail: Published information is available by 3digit commodity (CN 8).
