MUSEUMS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES ATTENDANCE SURVEY APRIL 2013

ELSTAT announces the results of the Survey on Museums and Archaeological Sites.


During April 2013, museums experienced a 19.1% increase in visitor numbers and a 2.0% increase in their receipts, in comparison with the corresponding month of 2012.

Same trend for archaeological sites which saws a 32.7% increase in visitor numbers and a 18.2% increase in the respective receipts, in comparison with the corresponding month of 2012(Table 1).

During the first four-month period of 2013, a 19.0% increase has been recorded in visitor numbers of museums and a 6.9% increase in their receipts, in comparison with the corresponding period of 2012.

Visitors of archaeological sites during the first four-month period of 2013 were also on the rise, recording an increase of 35.4%, so as the corresponding receipts by 29.4%, in comparison with the corresponding period of 2012 (Table 2).





EXPLANATORY NOTES

Museums and **Archaeological Sites Survey**

The Survey on Museums and Archaeological Sites Attendance has been producing results since 1970, based on data collected by the Archaeological Receipts Fund (ARF) of the Ministry of Culture. The ARF collects data on number of visitors and receipts from the tickets sold in the museums and archaeological sites of the country.

The corresponding data for the Acropolis Museum are available from December 2009 onward

Legal Framework

Since 1970, the present survey is a continuous one and has been producing results on a monthly and yearly basis in compliance with the Joint Ministerial Decision 15189/B379/73. ELSTAT is tabulating data concerning 150 museums and 120 archaeological sites all over Greece.

Reference Period 1/4/2013 έως 30/4/2013

Information on tickets

From January 2002 onwards, the number of museums' visitors includes both the visitors who have bought a ticket and the visitors with free admission. From 16-06-1996 onwards, the museums and the archaeological sites all over Greece have a paid admission for all the visitors, Greeks and foreigners, all over the year, except the following dates, which are free admission days

- -National Holidays,
- -Sundays during the five month period from 1 November to 31 March,
- -the first Sunday of April, May, June and October,
- -6 March (in memory of Melina Merkouri)
- -18 April (International Monuments Day),
- -18 May (International Museums Day),
- -5 June (International Environnent Day),
- -last weekend of September annually (European Heritage Days)
- -27 September (International Tourism Day)

Free admissions

Free admission exists for:

- -Young persons under 18 years of age, with a valid identification card that confirms their age,
- -Students of Universities and Higher Education Institutions of EU- countries, with valid student identification card or International Student Identity Card (ISIC),
- -Greek citizens on military service, with current military service identification card,
- -Employees of the Hellenic Ministry of Culture and of the Archaeological Resources Funds with current working identification card,
- -ICOM and ICOMOS cardholders,
- -Tour Guides with a valid working identification card from the Hellenic Tourism Organisation (EOT),
- -Free admission cardholders.

tickets

Number of flat rate From April 1999 onwards, in addition to the ordinary tickets, a new "flat rate ticket" is established, which is valid for both some museums and the nearby archaeological site. The total number of these flat rate tickets for April is: 54.115 and for the first four months total at 113,115.
