3. Statistical presentation

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3.1 Data description

The purpose of the Survey on Repatriated and Foreign Pupils in Primary Schools, which is conducted through the questionnaire Form " $\Sigma E-2\Gamma$ ", is to collect and tabulate data on the number of repatriated and foreign pupils attending primary schools (public and private) by gender, year of birth, class, country of birth and country of origin, citizenship, etc. at the beginning of the school year.

3.3 Sector coverage

All school units of Primary Schools of Greece.

3.4 Statistical concepts and definitions

Repatriated pupils are the pupils who, irrespective of their citizenship, have Greek origin and either were born in a foreign country and returned to Greece or they were born in Greece, resided for one year abroad and then they came back. Foreign pupils are the pupils whose neither the father nor the mother have Greek origin.

3.5 Statistical unit

School units of Primary Schools of Greece.

3.6 Statistical population

The survey is a census survey and it refers to all the school units of Greece in which repatriated or foreign pupils are enrolled.

3.7 Reference area

Greece, total, Region (NUTS 2) and Department (NUTS 3).

3.8 Time coverage

From the school year 1995/1996 to the school year 2010/2011.

3.9 Base period

5. Reference period

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The survey is conducted on a yearly basis with reference period of data the third week of October of each school year.

6. Institutional mandate

7. Confidentiality

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7.1 Confidentiality policy

The issues concerning the observance of statistical confidentiality by the Hellenic Statistical Authority (ELSTAT) are arranged by articles 6, 7 and 8 of the Law 3832/2010, as amended by article 90 paragraph 8 of Law 3842/2010 and by article 10 of Law 3899/2010, as well as by article 8 of Law 2392/1996, which was brought back into force, in accordance with article 90 paragraph 8 of Law 3842/2010.

Furthermore, ELSTAT disseminates the statistics in compliance with the statistical principles of the European Statistics Code of Practice and in particular with the principle of statistical confidentiality.

7.2 Confidentiality – data treatment

ELSTAT protects and does not disseminate data it has obtained or it has access to, which enable the direct or indirect identification of the statistical units that have provided them by the disclosure of individual information directly received for statistical purposes or indirectly supplied from administrative or other sources. ELSTAT takes all appropriate preventive measures so as to render impossible the identification of individual statistical units by technical or other means that might reasonably be used by a third party. Statistical data that could potentially enable the identification of the statistical unit are disseminated by ELSTAT if and only if:

- a) These data have been treated, as it is specifically set out in the Regulation on Statistical Obligations of the agencies of the Hellenic Statistical System (ELSS), in such a way that their dissemination does not prejudice statistical confidentiality or
- b) the statistical unit has given its consent, without any reservations, for the disclosure of data.

The confidential data that are transmitted by ELSS agencies to ELSTAT are used exclusively for statistical purposes and the only persons who have the right to have access to these data are the personnel engaged in this task and appointed by an act of the President of ELSTAT.

The Statistical Confidentiality Committee (SCC) operating in ELSTAT, examines issues referring to the observance of statistical confidentiality. Within its competence is to recommend on:

- the level of detail at which statistical data can be disseminated, so as the identification, either directly or indirectly, of the surveyed statistical unit is not possible;
- the anonymization criteria for the microdata provided to users;
- the granting to researchers access to confidential data for scientific purposes.

There is no predefined release date for the survey results. The final results of the survey with the data for the beginning of the school year are published twelve (12) months after the reference period.

After data collection through the survey questionnaire, logical checks are carried out in order to check correctness and completeness of data by contacting the involved agencies. Furthermore, electronic and quality checks are conducted on the tabulated data.

12. Quality management

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12.1 Quality assurance

During data processing, the data are also compared, mainly, with data from the previous school year, in order to detect any deviations. In case such deviations are identified, further clarifications are asked from the school units (Primary Schools), the Divisions of Primary Education and from the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs and any errors are dully corrected.

12.2 Quality assessment

The Divisions of Primary Education transmit the questionnaires which have been filled in by the school units to the Education Statistics Section where they are checked for completeness and correctness and are then compared with the corresponding questionnaires of the previous year.

13. Relevance

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13.1 User needs

The main national users are government agencies, such as the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs, the Ministry of Interior, Local Government, as well as university teachers, students, researches, the press, etc. At international level, the main user is Eurostat, as well as other international organisations (Unesco, OECD, etc.). Users' needs are recorded in the publication "Information Bulletin" which is published by the Division of Statistical

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13.2 User satisfaction

Generally, there is a good cooperation and immediate respond to users' needs, thus comments received by users being positive.

20. Statistical processing

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20.1 Source data

The questionnaire $\Sigma E-2\Gamma$ of the survey includes aggregate numerical data referring to the repatriated and foreign pupils of every public and private school unit (primary school), by gender, year of birth, class, country of birth and country of origin, citizenship, etc, during the beginning of the school year.

20.2 Frequency of data collection

Data are collected once a year, at the beginning of every school year.

20.3 Data collection

The Section of Education Statistics transmits the questionnaires ΣE -2 Γ , through the Divisions of Primary Education, to all the school units from which are collected the filled in questionnaires with the aggregate data for the school units under their supervision.

20.4 Data validation

The data are validated by means of a series of checks. The control of the questionnaires encompasses completeness, accuracy and logical checks at the level of the Division of Primary Education, electronic and quality checks. The main variables are compared with variables from other statistical sources. Primary data are cross-checked with the corresponding data of the previous year.

20.5 Data compilation

The data after having been collected undergo logical checks, are codified, are entered the electronic data base, are tabulated and finally they are published.
