3.1 Data description

The purpose of the Survey on Special Needs Education concerning Primary and Secondary Education [i.e. Special Needs Kindergartens, Special Needs Primary Schools, Special Needs Lower Secondary Education Schools, Special Needs Technical Lower Secondary Education Schools, Technical-Vocational Institutes (TEE)-level 1, Special Needs Upper Secondary Education Schools, Special Needs Technical Upper Secondary Education Schools, Technical-Vocational Institutes (TEE)-level 2, Workshops of Special Vocational Education and Training (EEEEK)], which is conducted through the questionnaire form "ΣΕ-8" is to collect and tabulate data on the number of private and public school units, on the teaching, specialized teaching and other (auxiliary) personnel employed in these units, on the number of pupils by gender, year of birth and category of special need, as well as on the number of foreign pupils by gender and citizenship, at the end of the school year.

Special Needs Education is provided in educational units of Primary and Secondary Education supervised by the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs, as well as in the Legal Entities under Public or Private Law which are supervised by other Ministries, wherever they operate (public utility institutions, nursing homes, etc.). These units of special needs education provide specialized education and training to people with special educational needs (learning disabilities, deaf or blind people with mental retardation, multiple disabilities, etc).

3.5 Statistical unit

School units of Special Needs Education of Primary and Secondary Education.

3.6 Statistical population

The survey is a census survey and it refers to all the school units of Greece.

3.7 Reference area

Greece, total, Region (NUTS 2) and Department (NUTS 3).

7. Confidentiality

7.1 Confidentiality policy

The issues concerning the observance of statistical confidentiality by the Hellenic Statistical Authority (ELSTAT) are arranged by articles 6, 7 and 8 of the Law 3832/2010, as amended by article 90 paragraph 8 of Law 3842/2010 and by article 10 of Law 3899/2010, as well as by article 8 of Law 2392/1996, which was brought back into force, in accordance with article 90 paragraph 8 of Law 3842/2010.

Furthermore, ELSTAT disseminates the statistics in compliance with the statistical principles of the European Statistics Code of Practice and in particular with the principle of statistical confidentiality.

7.2 Confidentiality - data treatment

ELSTAT protects and does not disseminate data it has obtained or it has access to, which enable the direct or indirect identification of the statistical units that have provided them by the disclosure of individual information directly received for statistical purposes or indirectly supplied from administrative or other sources. ELSTAT takes all appropriate preventive measures so as to render impossible the identification of individual statistical units by technical or other means that might reasonably be used by a third party. Statistical data that could potentially enable the identification of the statistical unit are disseminated by ELSTAT if and only if:

- a) These data have been treated, as it is specifically set out in the Regulation on Statistical Obligations of the agencies of the Hellenic Statistical System (ELSS), in such a way that their dissemination does not prejudice statistical confidentiality or
- b) the statistical unit has given its consent, without any reservations, for the disclosure of data.

The confidential data that are transmitted by ELSS agencies to ELSTAT are used exclusively for statistical purposes and the only persons who have the right to have access to these data are the personnel engaged in this task and appointed by an act of the President of ELSTAT.

The Statistical Confidentiality Committee (SCC) operating in ELSTAT, examines issues referring to the observance of statistical confidentiality. Within its competence is to recommend on:

- the level of detail at which statistical data can be disseminated, so as the identification, either directly or indirectly, of the surveyed statistical unit is not possible;
- the anonymization criteria for the microdata provided to users;
- the granting to researchers access to confidential data for scientific purposes.

12. Quality management

12.1 Quality assurance

During data processing, the data are also compared, mainly, with data from the previous school year, in order to detect any deviations. In case such deviations are identified, further clarifications are asked from the school units and the Divisions of Primary and Secondary Education and the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs and any errors are dully corrected.

12.2 Quality assessment

The questionnaires are filled in by the School Units and then the Divisions of Primary and Secondary Education transmit the completed questionnaires to the Regional Statistical Offices. Then the questionnaires are transmitted to the Education Statistics Section where they are checked for completeness and correctness and are then compared with the corresponding questionnaires of the previous school year.

13. Relevance <u>Top</u>

13.1 User needs

The main national users are government agencies, such as the Ministry of Education and Religious Affairs, the Ministry of Interior, Local Government, as well as university teachers, students, researches, the press, etc. At international level, the main user is Eurostat, as well as other international organisations (Unesco, OECD, etc.) Users' needs are recorded in the publication "Information Bulletin" which is published by the Division of Statistical

Information and Publications/Library Section every semester.

13.2 User satisfaction

Generally, there is a good cooperation and immediate respond to users' needs, thus comments received by users being positive.

At the same time, ELSTAT conducts a user satisfaction survey every six months.

20. Statistical processing

Top

20.1 Source data

The questionnaire Σ E-8 includes aggregate numerical data on each school unit of Special Needs Education of Primary and Secondary Education, referring to general characteristics, teaching (and other) personnel and its pupils.

20.2 Frequency of data collection

Data are collected once a year, at the end of every school year.

20.3 Data collection

The Section of Education Statistics transmits the questionnaires Σ E-8, through the Divisions of Primary and Secondary Education, to all the units of Special Needs Education from which are collected the filled in questionnaires with the aggregate data for the school units under their supervision.

20.4 Data validation

The data are validated by means of a series of checks. The control of the questionnaires encompasses completeness, accuracy and logical checks at the level of the Division of Primary and Secondary Education, electronic and quality checks. The main variables are compared with variables from other statistical sources. Primary data are cross-checked with the corresponding data of the previous year.

20.5 Data compilation

The data after having been collected undergo logical checks, are codified, are entered the electronic data base, are tabulated and finally they are published.

20.6 Adjustment
