

## Ad hoc module on transition from school to working life

### User oriented quality report

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| <b>Ad hoc module on transition from school to working life</b> | The survey on transition from school to working life took place in the 2 <sup>nd</sup> quarter 2000 together with Labour Force Survey and had as main target to study the transition of young people to labour market.  |
| <b>Legislation</b>   | The survey's specifications are determined by Commission Regulation 1926/1999.  |
| <b>Reference Period</b>  | The reference period for the main survey variables is the 2 <sup>nd</sup> quarter 2000.   |
| <b>Coverage</b>  | Persons 15 to 35 years old that were living in private households, staying (or intend to stay) at least 1 year in Greece and who have left continuous education within the past five or ten years. Individuals who permanently reside in collective houses (i.e. hospitals, hotels, asylums, homes for the elderly, orphanages, etc) are not covered by the survey.   |
| <b>Definitions</b>   | <p><b>Continuous education</b> is education that starts from primary education and continues without any interruption of more than 1 year duration.</p> <p><b>First significant job</b> is the first job, with duration at least 6 months, that started after completing studies in formal education.</p> <p><b>Employed</b> are persons aged 15 years or older, who during the reference week worked, even for just one hour, for pay or profit or they were working in the family business, or they were not at work but had a job or business from which they were temporarily absent.</p> <p><b>Unemployed</b> are persons aged 15-74 who were without work during the reference week (they were not classified as employed), were currently available for work and were either actively seeking work in the past four weeks or had already found a job to start within the next three months.</p> <p><b>Inactive</b> are those persons who are neither classified as employed nor as unemployed.</p> <p><b>Economically active population (labour force)</b> are persons either employed or unemployed.</p> <p><b>Unemployment Rate</b> is the ratio of unemployed divided by total labour force..</p> |
| <b>Methodology</b>   | The estimations are produced by a suitable unbiased estimator, which takes into account a) the probability of selection of every sampled household, b) the response rate in every primary sampling unit, c) the estimated population allocated by NUTS II areas, gender and age group).   |
