3. Statistical Presentation

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3.1 Data description

The Qualitative Characteristics of Resident Tourists Survey (Vacation Survey) is an annual sampling survey on households pursuant to Regulation (EU) No 692/2011 of the European Parliament and of the Council. It covers national tourism, i.e. domestic and outbound tourism of resident tourists. Data are collected on the number and the characteristics of resident tourists, e.g. age, sex, and on the number, the expenditure and the characteristics of trips, e.g. main purpose of the trip, main destination, duration of the trip, main means of transport, main means of accommodation etc. Furthermore, data regarding same-day visits are collected.

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3.4 Statistical concepts and definitions

The statistical concepts and definitions of the survey are described in Regulation (EU) No 692/2011 of the European Parliament and of the Council.

Further information on the definitions and the methodology of the survey are available in the <u>Methodological Manual for Tourism Statistics</u>.

3.5 Statistical unit

3.5.1 Statistical unit

For participation in tourism, the statistical unit is the individual.

For tourism trips and visitors making the trips, the statistical unit is the trip made by the individual.

3.5.2 Reporting unit

The reporting units are the members of the surveyed households.

3.6 Statistical population

For participation in tourism, the statistical population consists of all residents in Greece, aged 15 or over, residing in private establishments during the reference period. Persons residing in collective living quarters (hospitals, prisons, asylums, orphanages, etc) are not covered by the survey (they correspond to 2% of the total population and the vast majority belongs to the economically inactive population).

For tourism trips, the statistical population is consisted of all tourism trips with at least one overnight stay outside the usual environment, made by the residents of Greece, aged 15 years or over, which ended during the reference period.

For same-day visits, the statistical population is consisted of all same-day visits outside the usual environment, made by the residents of Greece, aged 15 years or over, during the reference period.

3.7 Reference area

The whole territory of Greece.

3.8 Time coverage

Data according to the Regulation (EU) 692/2011 of the European Parliament and of the Council are available from 2012 onwards.

Data according to Council Directive 95/57/EC on tourism statistics are available from 1999 to 2011.

3.9 Base period

Data for expenditure on tourism trips and same-day visits are expressed in euro.

6. Institutional mandate

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6.1 Legal acts and other agreements

Data are transmitted to Eurostat, OECD, World Tourism Organisation and the UN.

7. Confidentiality <u>Top</u>

7.1 Confidentiality policy

The issues concerning the observance of statistical confidentiality by the Hellenic Statistical Authority (ELSTAT) <u>are arranged</u> by articles 7, 8 and 9 of the Law 3832/2010 as in force, by Articles 8, 10 and 11(2) of the Regulation on Statistical Obligations of the agencies of the Hellenic Statistical System and by Articles 10 and 15 of the Regulation on the Operation and Administration of ELSTAT.

More precisely:

ELSTAT disseminates the statistics in compliance with the statistical principles of the European Statistics Code of Practice and in particular with the principle of statistical confidentiality.

7.2 Confidentiality – data treatment

- ELSTAT protects and does not disseminate data it has obtained or it has access to, which enable the direct or indirect identification of the statistical units that have provided them by the disclosure of individual information directly received for statistical purposes or indirectly supplied from administrative or other sources. ELSTAT takes all appropriate preventive measures so as to render impossible the identification of individual statistical units by technical or other means that might reasonably be used by a third party. Statistical data that could potentially enable the identification of the statistical unit are disseminated by ELSTAT if and only if:
 - a) these data have been treated, as it is specifically set out in the Regulation on Statistical Obligations
 of the agencies of the Hellenic Statistical System (ELSS), in such a way that their dissemination
 does not prejudice statistical confidentiality or
 - b) the statistical unit has given its consent, without any reservations, for the disclosure of data.
- The confidential data that are transmitted by ELSS agencies to ELSTAT are used exclusively for statistical purposes and the only persons who have the right to have access to these data are the personnel engaged in this task and appointed by an act of the President of ELSTAT.
- ➤ ELSTAT may grant researchers conducting statistical analyses for scientific purposes access to data that enable the indirect identification of the statistical units concerned. The access is granted provided the following conditions are satisfied:
 - a) an appropriate request together with a detailed research proposal in conformity with current scientific standards have been submitted;
 - b) the research proposal indicates in sufficient detail the set of data to be accessed, the methods of analyzing them, and the time needed for the research;
 - c) a contract specifying the conditions for access, the obligations of the researchers, the measures for respecting the confidentiality of statistical data and the sanctions in case of breach of these obligations has been signed by the individual researcher, by his/her institution, or by the organization commissioning the research, as the case may be, and by ELSTAT.
- ➤ Issues referring to the observance of statistical confidentiality are examined by the Statistical Confidentiality Committee (SCC) operating in ELSTAT. The responsibilities of this Committee are to make recommendations to the President of ELSTAT on:
 - the level of detail at which statistical data can be disseminated, so as the identification, either directly or indirectly, of the surveyed statistical unit is not possible;
 - the anonymization criteria for the micro-data provided to users;
 - the granting to researchers access to confidential data for scientific purposes.
- The staff of ELSTAT, under any employment status, as well as the temporary survey workers who are employed for the collection of statistical data in statistical surveys conducted by ELSTAT, who acquire access by any means to confidential data, are bound by the principle of confidentiality and must use these data exclusively for the statistical purposes of ELSTAT. After the termination of their term of office, they are not allowed to use these data for any purpose.

- Violation of data confidentiality and/or statistical confidentiality by any civil servant or employee of ELSTAT constitutes the disciplinary offence of violation of duty and may be punished with the penalty of final dismissal.
- ➤ ELSTAT, by its decision, may impose a penalty amounting from ten thousand (10,000) up to two hundred thousand (200,000) euros to anyone who violates the confidentiality of data and/or statistical confidentiality. The penalty is always imposed after the hearing of the defense of the person liable for the breach, depending on the gravity and the repercussions of the violation. Any relapse constitutes an aggravating factor for the assessment of the administrative sanction.

8. Release policy

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8.1 Release calendar

In September of each year ELSTAT publishes a release calendar which includes the exact dates for the publication of all Press Releases for the following year.

8.2 Release calendar access

The release calendar is available on the website of ELSTAT.

8.3 User access

The data are made available to all users simultaneously, by posting relevant tables on the <u>website of</u> ELSTAT.

Equal access of users to data is governed by the European Statistics Code of Practice of Eurostat, by respecting scientific independence and in an objective, professional and transparent manner in which all users are treated equitably.

9. Frequency of dissemination

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The annual data are transmitted to Eurostat within 6 months after the end of the reference year and are published on the website of ELSTAT within 9 months after the end of the reference year.

10. Dissemination Format

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10.1 News release

A press released on Vacation Survey is published once a year. For the reference year 2015 the press release was posted on the <u>website of ELSTAT</u> on 30/09/2016.

10.2 Publications

Data tables are posted on the website of ELSTAT.

Moreover, the survey results are published in the regular publications of ELSTAT, namely <u>Living Conditions</u> in <u>Greece</u>, <u>Greece in Figures</u>, as well as in a special publication issued for the <u>Thessaloniki International Fair</u>.

10.3 On-line database

On-line database is not available, but data tables are posted on the website of ELSTAT (see 10.2)

10.3.1 Data tables - consultations

The hits to the website of ELSTAT (data tables and metadata), as regards the Vacation Survey, amount to 9,914 webpage hits. There is no possibility to make a distinction between user's consultations on data tables and user's consultation on metadata.

10.4 Micro-data access

Micro-data are made available to users after submitting a request to the Division of Statistical Information and Publications,

12. Quality management

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12.1 Quality assurance

The survey is compiled in compliance with Regulation 692/2011 and the European Statistics Code of Practice.

Additionally, the quality is ensured by the quality policy of ELSTAT.

12.2 Quality assessment

Checks, crosschecks and comparisons of data taking place at each stage of the production - where any identified errors are duly corrected - ensure that the produced statistics are of high quality.

13. Relevance <u>Top</u>

13.1 User needs

The main users of the survey are:

- The Ministry of Tourism
- Agencies that carry out studies and researches, such as the Bank of Greece, the Institute for Tourism Research and Forecasts, universities, etc.
- Government bodies

Enterprises, individual users.

13.2 User satisfaction

For every data request, users are asked to fill in a questionnaire on user satisfaction.

The results of the <u>User Satisfaction Survey</u> are made available by the Section of Dissemination of Statistical Information.

13.3 Completeness

The survey collects information on all the variables stipulated in the EU Regulation 692/2011 and it takes into consideration the guidelines of the methodological manual on tourism statistics.

14. Accuracy and reliability

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14.1 Overall accuracy

The concepts and definitions of variables, as well as the survey methodology, are in line with the European standards and Regulations. The estimation methods which are used ensure the production of accurate results. Furthermore, an ESTAT tool (EDIT- EBB) is used to check and validate data.

Overall accuracy of the survey data is good.

14.3 Non-sampling error

14.3.1 Coverage error

14.3.2 Measurement error

In order to eliminate measurement errors, the following steps are taken:

• Instructions, on how to fill in the survey questionnaire, are given to the survey interviewers.

- The staff of the Tourism Statistics Section is duly trained in order to check properly the completed questionnaires.
- Automated checks during data entry ensured by an electronic application.

14.3.3 Non response error

Non-response rate amounts to 14.4%.

14.3.4 Processing error

Qualitative and quantitative checks are conducted on the data in order to detect and duly correct data entry errors.

14.3.5 Model assumption error

15. Timeliness and punctuality

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15.1 Timeliness

The annual data are transmitted to Eurostat within 6 months after the end of the reference year and are published on the website of ELSTAT within 9 months after the end of the reference year.

15.2 Punctuality

The survey data for the reference year 2015 were published on time.

16. Comparability

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16.1 Comparability - geographical

The available data are comparable with the corresponding data of the other EU Member States, since the survey is conducted in compliance with EU Regulation 692/2011.

16.1.1 Assymetry for mirror - flows - statistical (coefficient)

16.2 Comparability - over time

The data are comparable over time because there have been no significant changes in the definitions and methodology, which are pursuant to EU Regulation 692/2011.

17. Coherence

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17.1 Coherence cross-domain

The survey data are not directly comparable with the corresponding data of the Household Budget Survey (HBS), of the Accommodation Statistics and of the Border Survey, due to significant differences in the concepts, the reference period and/ or the statistical population.

The data have internal coherence; there have been no significant changes in the definitions and methodology, which are pursuant to EU Regulation 692/2011.

18. Cost and Burden <u>Top</u>

Total cost and burden have not been estimated. The survey is conducted by external statistical interviewers and the average time needed to fill in each questionnaire is approximately 20 minutes. The annual budget of the survey amounts to approximately 90,000 euros.

19. Data revision Top

19.1 Revision policy

The data are revised, when necessary, in accordance with the Circular on the Revision Policy of ELSTAT.

19.2 Revision practice

The data of 2015 have not been revised.

20. Statistical processing

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20.1 Source data

The Vacation Survey is a sample survey that is conducted on a yearly basis, on a sample of approximately 9,000 households. For each household a questionnaire is filled in pertaining to all the trips made by each household member during the reference year. For the reference year 2015, data from 7,479 households have been collected (size of initial sample: 8,740 households).

20.2 Frequency of data collection

Data are collected on an annual basis.

20.3 Data collection

The data are collected using a paper <u>questionnaire</u> that is filled in by survey interviewers during personal home interviews of the members of the surveyed households.

The selection of the sample is done using a two-stage stratified sampling method. The primary unit of the survey is the surface area (one or more subsequent city blocks) and secondary unit is the household. The ultimate unit of the survey are all the members of the surveyed households.

More information on the survey methodology is available in the <u>methodological note</u> (in Greek) of the survey.

20.4 Data validation

Validation checks are conducted both by ELSTAT and Eurostat.

Qualitative and quantitative checks, checks and cross-checks of primary data, as well as comparisons with the corresponding data of previous years are conducted on micro data and aggregated data.

20.5 Data compilation

Data compilation phases: data entry, data validation, data processing, extrapolation to the population, tabulation of data, evaluation of the survey results.
